PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY:

The last Sunday of October, is a special day set aside to honor the priesthood in the United States. This year the day falls of October 29. It is a day to reflect upon and affirm the role of the priesthood in the life of the Church as a central one.

DO NOT BE AFFRAID ...

...to go out on the streets and into public places, like the first Apostles who preached Christ and the Good News of salvation in the squares of cities, towns and villages. This is no time to be ashamed of the Gospel (cf. Rom 1:16). It is the time to preach it from the rooftops (cf. Mt 10:27). Do not be afraid to break out of comfortable and routine modes of living, in order to take up the challenge of making Christ known in the modern "metropolis". It is you who must "go out into the byroads" (Mt 22:9) and invite everyone you meet to the banquet which God has prepared for his people. The Gospel must not be kept hidden because of fear or indifference. It was never meant to be hidden away in private. It has to be put on a stand so that people may see its light and give praise to our heavenly Father (cf. Mt 5:15-16). -St John Paul the Great

On Oct. 30, Catholic parishes across the country will mark Priesthood Sunday in the same way they celebrate every Sunday – with the holy Eucharist.

For priests of the Archdiocese of Detroit, who on Sunday and every day of the week stand in persona Christi (in the "person of Christ") to offer the sacraments on behalf of the Catholic faithful, there's no better way to celebrate the gift of the priesthood than by celebrating the savior who gives it. Still, because God chooses human vessels to carry out His plans in the world, it is appropriate that Catholics across the archdiocese and the United States celebrate Priesthood Sunday each year to show their appreciation for the men who continue to say "yes" to God's calling.

The courage and generosity of priests, in giving of themselves in countless untold ways, is ever more important in today's Church. From attending to the practical needs of parishes and schools, giving of themselves through corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and dispensing God's grace through the sacraments, the ministry of a priest is irreplaceable.

"The reasons for this celebration (of Priesthood Sunday) should be obvious. The number of priests per Catholic has declined over the past 40 years," says Archbishop John G. Vlazny, retired archbishop of Portland, Ore. "Yet without a priest, no parish is able to be a Eucharistic community. It is important to reaffirm the importance of the priesthood of Jesus Christ and its central place in the life of our Church." For everything a priest does over the course of a year, Priesthood Sunday is a chance for parishioners to give back, whether through a simple "thank you," a gesture of appreciation or word of encouragement.



For many of us, we use this slogan to remind us how to set our clocks and watches to correct for daylight savings time - okay, us older folks who still may not simply depend upon their cell phones, and atomic clocks which auto correct. But this slogan is open to a wide variety of interpretations and uses. A way, certainly not "the only way", to understand this slogan is to suggest that continually "springing forward" is progress and to ever "fall back" is regression or stagnation. And, most, if not all, of us enjoy the benefits of modern technology. People are healthier and living longer because of great strides in healthcare. We have more information available to us today because of the unreal advances in communication. Scientists can reach deeper into the vastness of the universe and explore the smallest aspects of sub-atomic particles. These are not simply "springing forward", they are gigantic leaps. And, as much as people of my generation might complain about being "lost" in our ultra-sophisticated technological culture, I don't know of too many people who really want to go back to land-line rotary phones, hundred-pound 25" TVs, or waiting weeks for letters from our children (who never write anyways). We are rightly and justifiably spoiled by the conveniences produced by "springing forward".

The unfortunate side of our "Nuevo-mania" (obsession with all things new) is that we lose a sense of appreciation for the value of the "past". Those (young or old) who think they are "connecting" with 600+ friends on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram, are only fooling themselves. Connecting relationships are built one at a time, and require time and effort to maintain. Our modern culture seems to be quite content with superficial relationships, non-contentious associations of large groups. It allows for a "sense" of belonging, but isolates us from genuine intimacy. There still is great value in face-toface communication with others. There is still great value in writing out complete sentences, with proper spelling and grammar. There is still a great need to slow down a bit and assess our life's directions, and our deep values. There is still a great need for us to take the time to ask ourselves: Is what we say we believe demonstrated in how we behave?

There are many people, young and old, who believe that the Church was too eager to abandon the traditions of the past, the "gold standard" of liturgy and order, to initiate unnecessary reforms. There are many people, young and old, who argue that the Church's "springing forward" was nothing more than a leap off the edge of reason. And, there are people young and old alike, who fear "falling back" into the practices of the past is nothing more than a chaotic backward tumble into the abyss of senseless legalism. And probably most people fall somewhere in between these two extremes. I believe that it is important that we understand that the "message of the Apostles" was calling for a way of living, a system for understanding a Christian response to life. The goal of Vatican II was to keep the Church moving Forward, penetrating all aspects of the social order, lest we should fall back into the hatred and bigotry, the social disfunctionalisms of the past.

GO FOR THE WHOLE GRAIN!

Whole grains provide our bodies with vitamins, minerals, nutrients and fiber to help keep them healthy. They contain all three parts of the grain kernel - the bran, germ and endosperm in the original proportions after milling. Selecting the best type of grain can be confusing. The Dietary Guidelines for Americans recommend making half of the grains you eat whole grains. So whether you are eating bread, pasta, or rice, go for the whole grain option by following these tips:

•Don't be fooled--being brown does not mean it is a whole grain. The brown color can come from ingredients like molasses.

 Multigrain, five-grain, stone-ground, 100% wheat, cracked wheat or bran products are not necessarily made with whole grains. Read the Nutrition Facts panels on the packaging to make sure the word "whole" is before the name of the grain and is the first or second ingredient.

 Look for foods with the Whole Grain Stamp to see how much whole grain is in the food.
