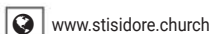

So, be SPIRITUAL ENTREPRENEURS OF GOD here and now! God bless us all.

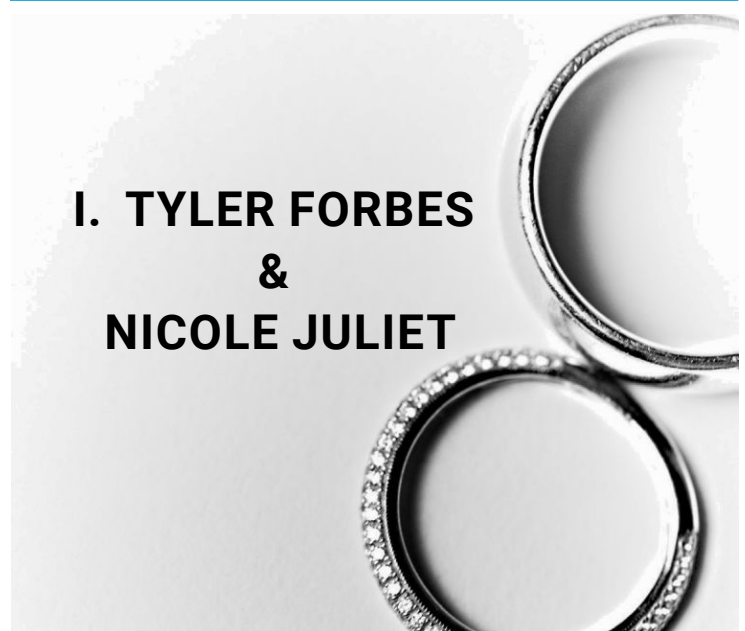


THE CHRISTMAS GIVING TREE

REMEMBERING

Deacon Bill Stimpson

There are occasions in life that cannot be celebrated, or experienced fully in just one day. Christmas and Easter are two "seasons" in the Church year because one day is not enough to begin to process the significance of these two events. For Christmas and Easter, it has been two thousand years since the "events" but we are still trying to assimilate the unimaginable significance of these two moments in human history. The loss of a loved one is another "event" in our human experience that needs more than a single day to appreciate the value of what is happening and what has happened. So, in the Church, November is the season of remembering. We begin by remembering all the saints with an obligatory Mass – All Saints Day, November 1, and a memorial celebration the next day for All Souls. Yet, throughout the month of November, we have other Masses for the deceased. The diocese has a Mass for all the priests and deacons who have died in the past year, and later the deacons have a special Mass for all the deacons and wives of deacons who have passed away over the previous year. November 11, Veterans Day (formerly Armistice Day – to celebrate the end of WW1) we remember all who have served our country in the military, both still living and those not. In November I remember my parents and grandparents. They are all dead now, for many years already, but I still remember them; sometimes dream of them. It was my parents and grandparents that taught me that every life was important. It wasn't just black or white lives; it wasn't just young or old, unborn or near death, to my parents and grandparents, everyone's life mattered, had intrinsic value. My two sisters, one a year older than me and the other two years younger, and I were the only three in my family that regularly attend any church. My family wasn't a "churchy" family, but we were well schooled in the sound principle of the "Golden Rule" (Do unto others...). In the quiet moments, I remember the good times, the family picnics, birthdays, my first cup of coffee with my dad, the camping and fishing. In the quiet, I remember the love, the closeness and the sense of peace. November is really the perfect month for this season of remembering as it serves as a pivotal point between summer and winter. For the month of November I will share some of the stories of those men and women who were my heroes, that helped to direct me toward living a Christian life. I invite you to also take time to remember your own stories, those who helped shape the person you hope one day to become. A point to keep in mind, as we go through this month, celebrating the many events of "remembering" that as this month comes to a close, we celebrate one of the more significant days on the calendar: Thanksgiving. In many families it is an opportunity to come together, share a meal, watch football, catch a short nap (after the big meal) laugh and tell the grandkids, nieces and nephews all the silly things we did as family

COPING WITH GRIEF DURING THE HOLIDAYS

As we celebrate All Souls Day and All Saints Day, it is important to also remember that Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year’s Day are annual holidays that can be a very difficult time for people who have experienced the death of a loved one. Memories of good times and togetherness at the holiday season serve to remind us of our loss. Watching others who are feeling thankful and are celebrating when we feel overwhelmed, lonely or sad can be very painful. Holidays force us to realize how much our lives have been changed by the loss of our loved one. Particularly in the first year, many bereaved are left with having to develop new holiday rituals and traditions.

The first step in coping with grief at the holidays is to acknowledge that the first holiday season is difficult and then to prepare for it in advance by making specific plans and obtaining the support that you need. Remember too, that sometimes anticipation of a holiday can be more difficult than the day itself.

Some Tips for Coping with Grief at the Holidays

Set realistic expectations for yourself. Remind yourself that this year is different. Decide if you can still handle the responsibilities you’ve had in the past. Examine the tasks and events of celebrating and ask yourself if you want to continue them. Take others up on offers to cook, shop, decorate, etc. Consider shopping by phone, internet or catalogs this year.

Surround yourself with people who love and support you. Share your plans with family and friends and let them know of any intended changes in holiday routine. Memories can sometimes be a source of comfort to the bereaved. Share your memories with others of holidays spent with your loved one by telling stories and looking at photo albums.

Try to avoid “canceling” the holiday despite the temptation. It is OK to avoid some circumstances that you don’t feel ready to handle, but don’t isolate yourself. Allow yourself some time for solitude, remembering and grieving, but balance it with planned activities with others.

Allow yourself to feel joy, sadness, anger – allow yourself to grieve. It is important to recognize that every family member has his/her own unique grief experience and may have different needs related to celebrating the holidays. No one way is right or wrong. Experiencing joy and laughter does not mean you have forgotten your loved one.

Draw comfort from doing for others. Consider giving a donation or gift in memory of you loved one. Invite a guest who might otherwise be alone for the holidays. Adopt a needy family during the holiday season.

Take care of yourself. Avoid using alcohol to self-medicate your mood. Try to avoid the hustle and bustle of the holiday season. Physical exercise is often an antidote for depression. Writing in a journal can be a good outlet for your grief.

Create a new tradition or ritual that accommodates your current situation. Some people find comfort in the old traditions. Others find them unbearably painful. Discuss with your family the activities you want to include or exclude this year.

The most important thing to remember is there is no right or wrong way to celebrate the holiday season after the death of a loved one, and that the best way to cope with that first holiday season is to plan ahead, get support from others and take it easy.

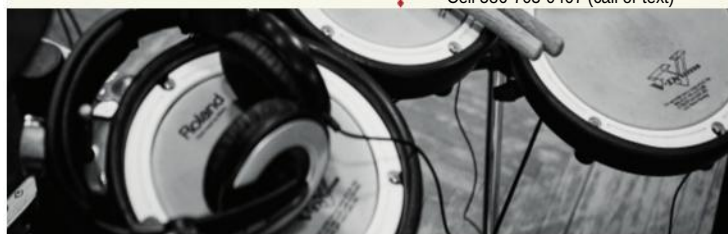

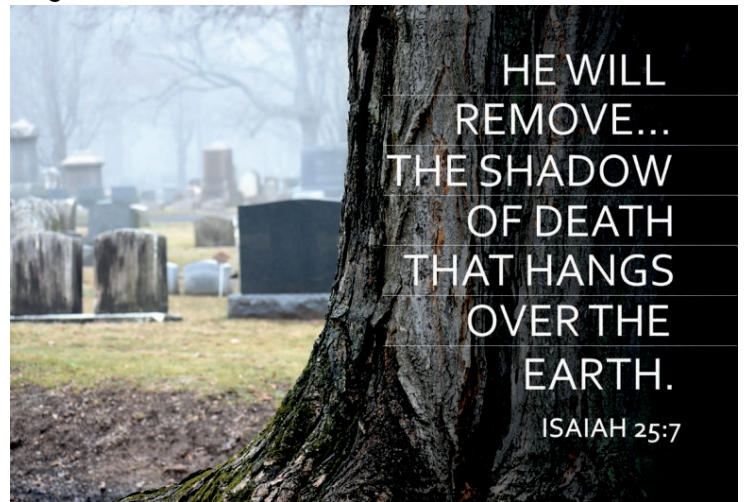

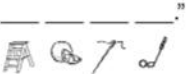
