

ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS: Paradise of our Memories

Breaking barriers! This is the main theme of our three night Advent Series this year. Spiritual obstacles are sometimes like "dragons" in front of our gates and will always be there. In our culture, the Season of Advent is a time of light and of shadow. While commercial countdown to Christmas begins, the Church calls us to a period of deep reflection and spiritual preparation for the celebration of the mystery of God becoming like us. On the one hand, cities and towns are lit up in fanciful ways. Most of all, it is also a time of spiritual silencing as we are called to look within ourselves in the midst of internal voices saying, "Get busy!" And the Lord says, "Quiet down!" To prepare for Christ's coming.

Advent and Christmas seasons remind us of prevailing memories, feelings and hopes in all of us; of our deep yearnings within every person for home, family, friendship, unity and peace. Advent and Christmas are the "paradise of our memories." We all want a memorable moment. But what are we really willing to give up to bring the promise of Christ's birth to our soul? Are we willing to be like Jesus and break down the barriers? Are we willing to cast off the deeds of darkness?

Are we willing to match the preparations we make on the outside over the next four weeks with a similar preparation on the inside?

This is the time to look at the quality of our Catholic life: our regular participation at Mass, our personal prayer life, our dealings with others - especially the needy, our honesty, our truth-telling, our respect for the reputation and property of others, our commitment to our family. to our spouse, our commitment to the great social justice issues the Church has embraced today — the poor, the sacredness of human life, the strengthening of family and marriage life. It is very tempting, and very easy, to get so wrapped up in the artificial lights of this season that we can forget the true light, the light of Christ: "Cast off the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light."

One of our resolutions at this moment is a quality time to start the family practice of gathered prayer before dinner; a good time to select some charity to assist from the many that come our way at this time of year; a good time to revive old friendships, restore broken connections and heal some family rifts.

Let's make this season a moment of its transforming power; a power which isn't found not in the changes that happen on the outside but the changes that happen within our heart. Don't let the potential of these days of Advent get lost in all the other preparations for Christmas. Advent is another chance to cast off the deeds of darkness and experience once more a Light that lasts.

As God embraces our human nature to disrupt the barriers, you and I can do the same thing: break the barriers! GOD BLESS US.

DID YOU CATCH IT?

A few weeks back, in my article And The Light Goes On, I presented two math problems. One problem was adding fractions, and the other was the relationships of equations. In both problem resolutions, there were computational errors. As I write this article, only two people brought the errors to my attention. I suspect that there were several more who caught the error, but were too forgiving to mention them. I suspect though that there were a larger number of people who read the article and did not take the time to check the math. Part of me is flattered that allows my ego to think that people simply agree with everything I write. Most of me though, is more disturbed that more people did not question the errors. I do not write my article in order to build an audience of faithful readers, but to challenge the way we - including myself - see life and our responsibility as Christians within the context of that life. Not every aspect in life is as exact as a math problem, but that only means that we need to search more deeply to arrive at a deeper truth. It should not matter who says whatever, in writing or orally, we should always listen with a discerning ear. The validity of any idea is not found in the person proclaiming a "truth" but in the internal validity of the truth itself.

A hundred years ago, almost any widely circulated idea, written or oral, was closely scrutinized by academics to ensure a measure of external and internal validity. In today's world of self-publishing, blog sites, Twitter accounts, and Facebook, there are no longer built in filters to catch the "errors". Yet, I am sure that you, like me hear people quote something they read online as though it were the unquestionable gospel truth. There are still people who believe that Neiman Marcus charged a person \$250.00 for a cookie recipe; if you put your pin number into an ATM in reverse order, that the police are automatically called to respond – Good Urban Legends, but lacking truth. These are rather innocuous false ideas floating around in cyber space, but when we accustom ourselves to not questioning what we believe, challenging statements and ideas, we allow ourselves to be manipulated by those who are more concerned in self-interests than in truth. Thus, in my opinion, the important question we should ask is "Why is something true, or false?".


I do welcome feedback, questions about what I write, and why I seem to focus so much on "social" issues. I do not pretend to be "the final word" on any subject, or theological teaching. I may have some interest or education in some areas more than others, but I present my opinions, not my "dogma". I do try to base my opinions on the teachings of the Church, correct interpretations of history, and give credit to those whose writings and ideas have inspired me. But, in the long run, I present to you, the reader, an opinion. When you do not understand or agree with my opinion, please let me know. It is just as likely we both have something more we can learn through dialogue.
