This Second Week of Advent is filled with many great spiritual opportunities.

On Tuesday we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the "Patroness of the Americas". Our Lady of Guadalupe and her story is a celebration of God's love fo the poor and powerless, and for all who live on the margins. The Blessed Mother appeared to St. Juan Diego Cuauhtiatoatzin, a native Mexican, farmer, and laborer, while he was on his way to attend Mass on December 9, 1531. The appearance took place on Tepeyac Hill, outside Mexico City. The Blessed Mother appeared as a young, pregnant, indigenous woman, wearing native dress. The Blessed Mother asked St. Juan Diego to tell the bishop to build a chapel on the site. Juan Diego went to the bishop with the request, but the bishop scoffed at him. At the Blessed Mother's instructions, Juan Diego returned to the bishop carrying fresh roses (it was winter time!) in his tilma (cloak). When he unfurled the tilma before the bishop, the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe was imprinted on the inside. The bishop believed, and built the church.

The fascinating image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is decidedly appropriate for Advent. It is full of richly symbolic details. The black sash tied around Mary's waist, which was worn by pregnant indigenous women, indicates that Mary is carrying the infant Jesus in her womb. Other details--the rays of light behind Mary, the angels at her feet, even the stars on her gownhave cosmic symbolism, appropriate to this season of meditation on the end time. This Feast celebrates Mary's special care and motherly presence for not only Hispanic peoples, but for all peoples of America. We strongly encourage you to join our local Hispanic community in the celebrating the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe here at St. Isidore this Tuesday. We begin at 6:30 AM with the celebration of "Mananitas", a beautiful morning serenade to the Blessed Mother. Our usual parish weekday Mass will follow at 8:00 AM. (Note: there will be no Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament this Tuesday.) Then, at 7:30 PM, we will gather with the local Hispanic community for a very festive and beautiful celebration of the Feast. This is one of my favorite liturgies of the year. The celebration will include festive music and prayerful dance in colorful native dress, pious processions with flowers and prayers to our Lady, presented especially by children, and the dramatization of the story of Juan Diego and our Lady. It is a great celebration, and a beautiful experience of the very pious and joyful Hispanic spirituality and culture. In recent years several hundred members of the local Hispanic Community, including many young families with school-aged children, have joined us for the Mass. We encourage you to do so as well, as we honor the Patroness of the Americas. It is a great experience of the Hispanic culture and spirituality. It is also a way we can support our local immigrant community during a time of great stress and concern

The Knights of Columbus "Light Up For Christmas" event will take place at 6:30 on Tuesday. This has become a new tradition at St. Isidore, as we continue our Advent preparation by lighting up the outdoor Manger scene in front of the church. We will gather in the church and then, weather-permitting, process to the Manger for the blessing. It will include the singing of Christmas carols, and a Hot Chocolate social afterwards. It is especially geared to our young people. We thank the Knights for sponsoring this event, and the Knights and our Ushers Club for setting up the manger, and providing the Christmas Lights which surround our church building.

The week will also include the third part of our amazing "Breaking Barriers" Advent series on Friday night at 7:00 PM. The first two nights of the series have been great celebrations of Advent prayer and fellowship. The title of this Friday's celebration is "What Kind of Throne". It will be led by our choir and orchestra, and

will include scoundscapes, Biblical and poetic lyrics, and moving narrative of the Birth of Christ. The evening will conclude with the decoration of Christmas cookies to take home, which was a HUGE success with our young people last year (and some of us not-so-young!). Please, bring your children and grandchildren, especially those who may have not been to Church in a while. It is a great way for us to connect! And for all of us to make ourselves ready for the Coming of the Lord!



REFRESHING THE VISION


Jovce and I have neighbors who are Jehovah Witnesses. They are wonderful people, very fervent in their beliefs, but respectful of other's beliefs. We have discussions concerning how we understand our faith's differently, but we do so in non-confrontational questionings. There are many ideas that we have in common, but, there are many more that we will probably never agree more on than to "disagree". Obviously, they only use their version of the King James Bible – New World Translation. And they most often take a very literal understanding of what is written. Their moral code though, is very closely related to the teachings of the Catholic Church. Jehovah Witnesses do not believe in abortion or divorce, and follow along the lines of much of the Catholic Social Teachings. They do not stand for the National Anthem, nor vote in public elections. But, they are not "protesting" they simply understand that they have only ONE allegiance - to God's Kingdom. However, they, like many of our Protestant brothers and sisters, do not believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist; and they like, Mormons, do not accept the divinity of Christ, nor do they accept Christ's resurrection.

Every year the Church begins a New Liturgical Year on the first Sunday of Advent. This year we are again in Cycle B, and our Gospels are from the Gospel of Mark. And again, this year, we are presenting another Advent Series on Friday Nights. The theme of this year's presentation is to challenge us to consider the "Barriers" in our faith that prevent us from experiencing the true joy of Christmas, and living a life according to God's ways. This year's program challenges us to break down these barriers that divide our hearts, our parish, and our community. Each year, in the Season of Advent, we are challenged to hit the button and eliminate the clutter of ideas, attitudes, and actions that interfere with our being valid witnesses of the Catholic faith. An important concept to keep in mind here is that there is a difference between a Refreshed understanding and understanding.

The Church promotes a LIVING faith, a faith that is constantly growing, becoming more (not specifically different). But, faith like life, picks up odds and ends that are more burdensome than their value. Breaking the Barriers, hitting the *refresh* button challenges us to unburden our lives, not to necessarily re-invent our faith. Just as every young child is emotionally energized in anticipation of Christmas, and Santa Claus. We too can become faithfully energized in anticipation of the coming of Christmas. We can clear away the clutter in our lives that separate families; the clutter of "sacred angers", the clutter of "bitter disputes", the clutter of "distances of miles and time". Advent is the time to find, once again, the "magic" that fills our lives with hope, with joy, and with a desire for real peace (not truces).

When you start to feel tired and achy, how do you know if you have a common cold, the seasonal flu, or allergies? Determining the symptoms and duration may help lead you to a treatment plan. As always, consult your health professional to choose the best therapy

COMMON COLD:

- Duration: Up to 2 weeks
- Symptoms: Stuffy, runny nose, sore throat, cough.
- Treatment: Rest, fluids, over-the-counter (OTC) medicines to ease symptoms.

SEASONAL FLU:

- Duration: 1-2 weeks
- Symptoms: High fever (100-102 degrees F, or higher in children), headache, aches and pains, weakness, exhaustion, cough, chest discomfort
- Treatment: Rest, fluids, OTC medicines, prescription antiviral drugs

AIRBORNE ALLERGY:

- Duration: Will last as long as allergens (such as pollen, dust, pet dander) are present
- Symptoms: Stuffy, runny nose, itchy, watery eyes
- Treatment: Antihistamines, decongestants, nasal steroids







WE PRAY FOR THE SICK

Unless expressly requested by the family, usually the name of the sick person will be taken off the list after three months. In the instance of an ongoing serious, critical, or terminal status that is known to us, that policy will not apply.






