THE PILGRIM'S CORNER

COFFEE FOR BOB, PLEASE...

Last Sunday's Gospel teaches us what the disciples were doing when Jesus called them. They were doing their day's work, catching the fish and mending the nets. God's call can come to any one of us, not only in the house of God, not only in the Blessed Sacrament, but also in the middle of the day's work, even in the coffee shop!

It was the same calling in the middle of the day a few weeks ago. I was in the coffee shop between Gratiot and 24 Mile Road when I saw a heartbroken person desperately looking for something to eat inside the garbage. My two friends and I decided eagerly to invite him in his torn jacket to sit with us and have some coffee and perhaps offer him something to eat. He accepted our invitation and finally, a warm connection was built in our dialogue and letting us maybe help him in some ways. Bob lost his home and had been homeless for almost a year; with his bike, sometimes he earned a few dollars to buy some food and buy some over the counter medicine for his sick wife. It was a spiritual comfort for my part to let him be part of my journey that day. Bob, accepted my friendship! From that moment, I realized something imperative, and much more beyond social justice; it's a love in action, kindness beyond measure that knows no boundaries, no color, race and language, it's not even spiritualizing knowing that Christ is present in the poor!

"Caritas Christi urget nos" means the love of Christ compels us; and that everything I have is not my own, but I have a sacred duty to use what God has given me to share it to somebody needy than I. Charity is not just enough: we need social awareness and transformation. I don't think we can be part of any evangelical movement in the church, without being as clearly committed to social justice as the church has been in the past; we just can't preach the Gospel and not live it. This is very clear from the heart of our Sacred Scripture having this duty and responsibility. We can always do this collectively, but also a face-to-face engagement with somebody like BOB could be an effective form of charity through our personal witnessing. Catholic social teaching maintains that countering poverty encompasses justice and charity, institutional reform and personal compassion. Every community who is involved to the evangelical charity for the poor should always provide an excellent model of this two-branched attitude.

Bob had an obligation to earn his daily bread and we, as a CHURCH should not permit that this right is thoroughly deprived of. If Bob was hungry, and as part of the BODY OF CHRIST, I cannot just lie comfortably on my bed, while another person is starving and freezing in the street.

You can listen to some of those related stories, this coming February 3rd, after our 4:30 p.m. Mass at the Parish Social Hall. We would like to cordially invite you to join us and listen to the stories of our DACA families and Friends.

DIABETES AND DENTAL PROBLEMS

Diabetes is a disease that can affect the whole body—your eyes, nerves, kidneys, heart and other important systems in the body. It can also affect your mouth. People with diabetes face a higher than normal risk of oral health problems.

The link between diabetes and oral health problems is high blood sugar. If blood sugar is poorly controlled, oral health problems are more likely to develop. Oral hygiene tips for people with diabetes:

- Have your teeth and gums cleaned and checked by your dentist twice a year
- Prevent plaque buildup on teeth by using dental floss at least once a day
- Brush your teeth after every meal. Use a soft-bristled toothbrush
- If you wear dentures, remove them and clean them daily
- If you smoke, talk to your doctor about ways to quit
- Keep your blood sugar as close to normal as possible
- Make sure to give your dentist your doctor's name and phone number
- Bring your dentist a list of the names and dosages of all medicines you are taking

Keep in mind that healing might take longer in people with diabetes.

Follow your dentist's post-treatment instructions closely

People with diabetes who smoke are at an even higher risk. Smoking seems to impair blood flow to the gums, which might affect wound healing in this tissue area.

Keeping your mouth and gums healthy is particularly important if you have diabetes. Since people with diabetes are more prone to conditions that might harm their oral health, it is vital to follow good oral hygiene practices, pay special attention to any changes in your oral health, and to call your dentist immediately if such changes occur.

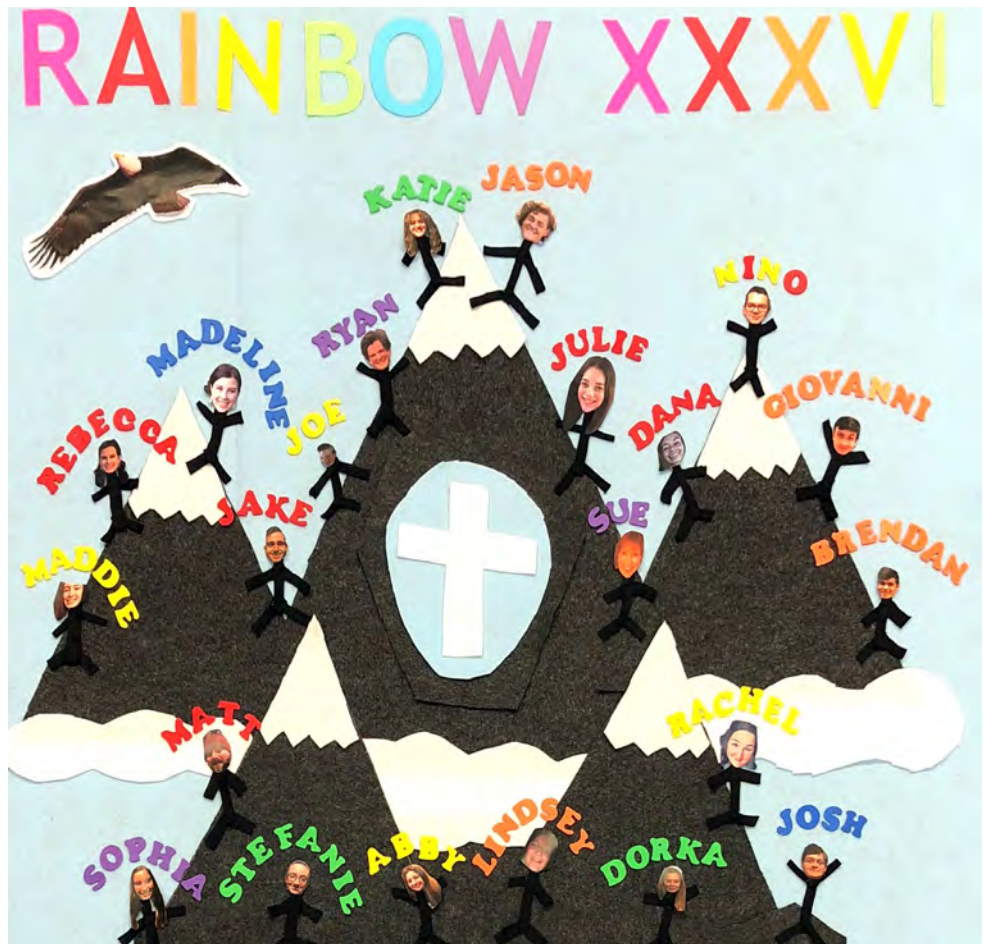

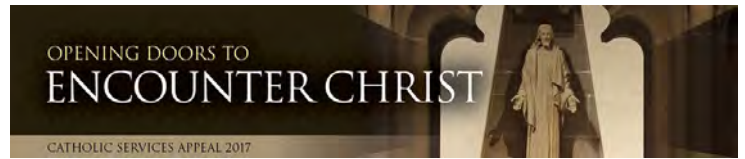

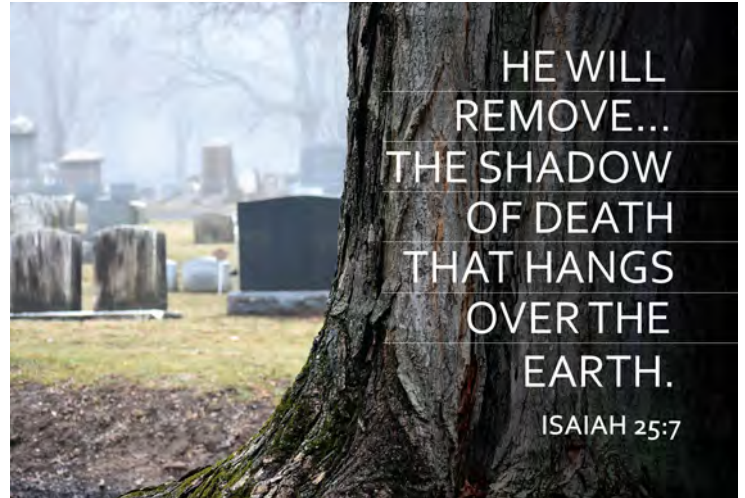
