

This Season of Lent is a forty-day, parish-wide retreat as we prepare to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ at Easter. There is a twofold focus to our Lenten observance. The first focus is on our "elect" (our "catechumens celebrated the Rite of Election at the cathedral yesterday and are now known as the "elect"), and our Candidates for full Communion with the Catholic Church. We join them in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as they prepare for the Easter Sacraments. They are the focus of our community Lenten observance.

On a more personal level, our second focus is on preparing ourselves to renew our Baptismal Vows at Mass on Easter Sunday. We need to open ourselves to God's grace in order to recommit ourselves to living as baptized, joyful disciples of Christ. We need God's grace to reject Satan and evil, and fully embrace our belief in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

## THE ABC'S OF MERCY ASK FOR HIS MERCY.

The scriptures are filled with examples of how to trust in God and ask for His Mercy: the faith of Abraham and Moses who pleaded and "bargained" with God; the man who persuaded his friend to get up in the middle of the night to lend him some bread; the persistent widow who secured justice from the unjust judge; the Canaanite woman who "argued" with Jesus about her right to His mercy and the witness of Mary whose appeal for mercy at Cana led Jesus to perform His first public miracle.

#### BE MERCIFUL TO OTHERS.

Repeatedly the Scriptures remind us that the measure we use for others is the measure God will use for us (Lk 6:38). "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy" Mt 5:7. "But judgment is without mercy to one who has shown no mercy" (Jas 2:13). The parables of the Good Samaritan, the Rich Man and Lazarus, and the Unforgiving Servant all demonstrate this essential truth that only if we give mercy can we hope to receive it, for we will be Judged on the basis of our merciful actions.

#### COMPLETE TRUST IN JESUS.

Trust means that we agree to let God be good, instead of trying to be God ourselves. It means that we agree that God can write the script of our lives, instead of insisting on our own script. It means that we agree with the pledge we make in the "Our Father". "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." It means that even in our moments of agony, we agree with the cry of Jesus in the Garden, "Not My will, but Yours be done." (Lk 22:42)

#### WHEN I WAS YOUNG...

Often enough, I refer back to some childhood experience in my articles. I do this because I believe that while I have many "personal experiences", I believe that my childhood is not that different than most people my age. I believe that most people my age were raised to "dress up" for church (Protestants and Catholics alike), to say "yes sir or yes mam", doors were left unlocked, and children could safely walk to school. I believe that most families went to some church on Sunday. Certainly the programing for TV and movies would never allow what we accept today as "PG13", let alone "R". "XXX" rated films were "smokers" that were reserved for private viewings and not allowed in any public theater – regardless of a person's age. For the people of my generation, we were somewhat protected in a "cocoon" of innocence.

Yes, there were rapes, murders, robberies, adultery, drug abuse and alcoholism when I was young, but these were not dramatized in the media as they are today. The children of today have none of the "protective" innocence were enjoyed as children. Before our children begin kindergarten, we school them "not to talk to strangers", to "inspect" the candy received at Halloween, to be suspicious of adults. And, as responsible adults and parents, we must do these to protect our children. Not to do so would be negligent. However, I wonder if we haven't gone too far, preparing instead, our young people to somehow consider the level of violence, and sexual exposure as "normal" behavior.

What changed? Why does there seem to be so much graphic violence in our world today? There are a lot of factors that can be identified as major contributors, but there is no one single cause nor simple solution. I might suggest though three major contributors to what I consider a decline in our national moral fabric: 1. Dr. Spock and "child psychology"; 2. The Second Vatican Council; and 3. the Viet Nam War. My parents were raised under a social network that supported the role of "contributor" to the "common good". The psychologist Dr. Benjamin Spock proposed that such a form of child rearing was too "destructive" to a child's natural talents and that parents should allow their children greater freedom in their choices. The Second Vatican Council "changed" the "Mass"! And the Viet Nam War challenged the legitimacy of governmental actions.

There was (and still is) a "value" in some of the principles of child raising promoted by Dr. Spock. Parents should not impose their "dreams" on their children [I did not need to be a star athlete to satisfy the dream my dad had for me.] I did though, have to be a good citizen. The principle of faith were never changed the Second Vatican Council, though the particular rules may have changed to ensure a proper understanding of the basic principle [Yea, I know, somewhat circular.] L.B.J.'s bungling of the Vietnamese war destroyed a fundamental trust in governments. For the first time, American men and women were sent to fight a war with no dedicated government desire to "win". Family, Church and Government – the three major socializing groups of any civil society were called to question.







#### PERMANENT DIACONATE






