

# Adopt-a-Stream!

If you read the bulletin two weeks ago, you saw that St. Isidore adopted a stream, that portion of the North Branch of the Clinton River south of 32 Mile Rd, west of Romeo Plank just off the Pine Valley Golf Course.

April 21, a Saturday, at the CRWC office on Auburn, we will be attending a class on identifying aquatic insects.

This helps biologists determine the health of the stream by which insects are found and which are not found.

The following is blurb from the Clinton River Watershed Council: The Clinton River Watershed Council's Adopt-a-Stream program is a volunteer based program that empowers community members to protect local streams and rivers by monitoring their health. Volunteers are trained, teamed up, assigned stream sites, given equipment, data sheets and a collection protocol, and then sent out to gather information on streamside habitats, physical characteristics and benthic macroinvertebrate populations. Twice a year – May and October – teams of trained volunteers visit their adoption site and collect data. After the initial 3 hour training session each volunteer dedicates approximately 3-4 hours of their time per year.

As you can see, the commitment to this worthy endeavor is not a lot of time and is a tremendous help in cleaning up our waterways, providing recreational opportunities for all of us.

If you are interested in helping, please call the office, and if I'm not available, leave your name and number and I will get back to you. I anticipate registering volunteers within two to three weeks.

**JOHN 3:16** 

It is my suspicion that whether one is a Christian or not, a believer or not, most everyone is familiar with this particular Gospel verse. John 3:16 – For God so loved the world that He sent His only begotten Son, that who believes in Him shall have life everlasting. As a Baptist, this is one of the first Bible verses I memorized. This, I believe is one of the most popular Bible verses, but also one of the more misunderstood verses as well. At face value alone, one only needs to "believe" that Jesus is the Son of God, and their "salvation" is secured. If this is a correct understanding of this verse, then we are left with agreeing that the demons cast out by Jesus are "saved". The demons know who Jesus is, they know Jesus is the chosen one, the Son of God, therefore they must enjoy "life everlasting."

As a young Baptist, this verse was part of my mantra on why Catholics did not need to go to "Confession" to get to heaven. Coupling this verse with St. Paul's letter to the Romans where Paul speaks of the power of faith to save (Rm 3:28 - For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works of the law.) But, this understanding is an occupational hazard for those who rely sole on verbiage, and not on context. Whether Protestant or Catholic, Scripture Scholars generally agree that one cannot arrive at a defendable interpretation if this person only considers a "dictionary" approach to the Scriptures. Over the centuries, words and their meanings change in emphasis and/or meaning. Catholic apologist, Stephen Ray discusses this verse from John's Gospel, and explains how the word BELIEVE was understood in the time of Jesus: "Belief" is more than an ascent of the mind to accept a premise or an idea as "true", belief is changing one's behavior, attitude to reflect the pronounced belief. Mr. Ray suggests that a more correct understanding of the Biblical concept of "believe" would be OBEY.

If we would understand the passage as: God so loved the world that He sent His Son into the world, so that those who obeyed Him might have life everlasting. This understanding would then more closely follow along with St. Paul using Abraham as an example of "faith". Abraham was reckoned faithful because he obeyed God. In the Hebrew Scriptures, faith in God was measured by one's obedience to God's ways. The God, through the prophets in Hebrew Scriptures frequently condemns Israel for her lack of obedience, her lack of faith. Jerimiah complains at God's prompting - "Yet for all this her false sister Judah did not return to me with her whole heart, but in pretense, says the Lord." Jer 3:10. Even more pointedly is Jerimiah 9:23 - "Thus says the Lord: 'Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom, let not the mighty man glory in his riches; but let him who glories in this, that he understands and knows me, that I am the Lord who practice steadfast love, justice and righteousness in the earth; for in these things I delight, says the Lord"

More important than anything that comes from our lips are the attitudes born in our hearts. More important than how deeply we contribute is how deeply we love, practice justice and God's righteousness.





**LENTEN GIVING TREE - 2018** 

This weeks article is focusing on Americans for International Aid and Adoption (AIAA) - Amsa Rehabilitation Center

AIAA has been working with kids in Korea for more than 40 years. Not all of the work has been in adoption. They have also supported kids who would not be adopted because of illness or disability. Social Welfare Society (SWS) has supported Amsa Rehabilitation Center for a very long time. Here is some information from SWS:

The living space for the children and enhancing the rehabilitation programs is continuous. Now they are planning to move the children upstairs and enlarge the space for therapies and educational programs on the first floor. They would like to protect the children's privacy more by extending the living space and it will be necessary to provide personal items as well in the near future.

In terms equipment, the cost for the Therapy Table would be \$3,384.00, Therapy Desk would be \$3,102.00 and the Kit for the Language Therapy would be \$67.68. Any donations for andy of the items would gratefully appreciated.
