THE PILGRIM'S CORNER

The overflowing rays in white, blue and red colors embody His DIVINE GRACE which embraces everything and everyone; going beyond culture, race, age and orientation inspiring a very welcoming environment, all encompassing and belongingness in God's divine compassion. Christ's face as the face of a merciful father never ever tires of forgiving us. Mercy and compassion are the best medicines we can offer to our sick society today: it transforms the world, changes everything, and makes the world less uncaring and more just. The comfort of mercy should reach everyone. Mercy takes us to the heart of the relationship between God and human beings; mercy is the name of God himself (Pope Francis).

With Jesus' death and resurrection, the definitive word had been proclaimed. God suddenly breaks in, upsets all the rules and offers new possibilities. God once more comes to meet us, to create and strengthen His promise present from the beginning; the mercy He promised from the start; our creation, our history, human life; this promise had always been about God's desire to redeem us by his merciful gift of self.

Justice and mercy meet most intimately on the Cross of Christ. The cross is God's judgment on all of us and on the whole world, and it is there above all that God's mercy is revealed, in an action that defends us despite our guilt. In God's mercy, forgiveness would never be a cheap grace because Christ asks something of us, and we are accountable to Him; God's justice is not cheapened or condensed superfluous in the ministry of Jesus through his expensive gift of self on the cross, and in his resurrection. For God, justice is not enough; justice won't offer us the kingdom, and that's what God desires to offer us: by going beyond justice with his mercy and forgiveness. God's justice is his mercy given to everyone. We can only pay it back by taking seriously our own task. We who have encountered God's mercy are also called to become channels of mercy in our proclamation, our witness, and by being transformed ourselves.

Today as we celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy we also celebrate Fr. Ron's 40th Priesthood Anniversary. One of Fr. Ron's greatest gifts to St Isidore has been his being a great witness of the Gospel of Mercy in proclaiming it to his own life and ministry: to the Church, to the Archdiocese of Detroit, to the parishes where he served, to Retrouvaille, to the poor and the needy in the margins of the society, welcoming them all and letting them belong to our Christian community. He proclaims the Gospel and he lives it. Fr. Ron's gift of priesthood is his service as shepherd of God's Mercy of changing the world, of being viaduct of transformation of culture, and that "the world may have life in abundance" (John 10:10).

Lastly, like the Christian communities before, perhaps we will fail again and again in our efforts to proclaim and live that message with truthfulness, yet, we will never grow tired in rediscovering for ourselves the mercy of God; His immense generosity, the free gift of himself in compassion, made concrete and tangible in the life of the church, as gift for the world.



DEACON BILL

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

If you are a Willie Nelson fan, this title may bring to mind the song "On the Road Again", a song about his music tours. If you are of my generation or a fan of "old" movies, images of Bob Hope and Bing Crosby in one of their "Road to ..." may come to mind. Either image expresses the idea behind this article. We quite often hear (may even use ourselves) the image of a "road" to describe "life". We journey down the road of life... The "road of life" is full of twists and turns, frequent forks, and some roads traveled more than others. And, closing out the season of Lent, we begin the Easter season, with a renewed energy. Lent was a time of slowing down; a time of reflection, now is the time to introduce a new freshness into our activities and attitudes in living as Baptized Christians.

Just as Spring sparks new life into old trees, brings back the lilies, the lilacs, the daffodils, irises, and crocuses, Springtime energizes our spirits. In Springtime we shed the cocoons of winter, the heavy coats and sweaters, the houses, the condos and apartments. Springtime brings back the bicycles, the golf clubs, and gardening tools. Springtime brings back the "snow-birds" and a certain level of energy in fife that may go dormant during the long winter months. In every way I can think of, Spring and Easter bring about New Life.

Hopefully during Lent0 certain attitudes and/or behaviors were examined and found needing some adjusting to bring them back into alignment with the teachings of Christ and the Church. During the Easter Season of the Church, our Gospel Readings are taken from John's Gospel. John, as all the other Gospel writers, has a specific message contained in his Gospel. It appears that central to Matthew's Gospel is the understanding of "fulfillment"; in Mark's Gospel is the central idea of immediacy; and in Luke's Gospel the understanding of the all-inclusive love of God. The core of John's Gospel, seems to be a focus on Jesus' divine nature. The guestion asked by the Pharisees and Sadducees in the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke): "By whose authority ...?" is answered in John's Gospel. The authority of Jesus rests in his divine nature. In the Synoptic Gospels, the Messiahship of Jesus is a "job description" in John's Gospel, the divinity of Jesus is a state of "Being". In all the Gospels, Jesus teaches, but in John's Gospel, the teaching are longer, more frequent and challenging.

I know that for myself, I can at times become confused about my role as a deacon or even a Christian. As a deacon in the Church, I have some specific defined roles to fulfill. There are areas that I am allowed to function and others that are specifically excluded by their nature to priesthood. But being a deacon is larger than a set of functions, being a deacon is also recognizing and accepting the challenge of "being" a deacon. Being a Christian is more than a systematic sequence of activities, being a Christian is, at its core, a way of seeing and responding to the world around us. On this road, for the Christian, Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life (Jn 14:6).
