

THE RE-EMERGENCE OF PROPHECY IS A RE-IMAGINING OF THE PROPHET

Traditionally, I believe, that we commonly think of "The Age of Prophesy" to end with the last "prophet" of the Scripture. In Hebrew Scriptures, Malachi closes out the "prophetic age", where some Christian scholars extend the end of the "prophetic age" to conclude with the death of John the Baptist. And if we limit our understanding of being a "Prophet" to those identified in Scriptures as "prophets", then indeed the age of prophesy ended with the death of Malachi, or John the Baptist. If one considers a broader understanding of what a prophet is, then we might see that the age of prophesy never ends until the ultimate New Heavens and New Earth of the Parousia. If a Scripture Scholar were asked to name the Prophets, he or she would, most likely recite verbatim the names of all the prophets of Hebrew Scriptures. I imagine that most of us Catholics can only name a few of the "named prophets" of Scriptures. However, I do not imagine that scholar or the general population of laity begins to consider Bob, or Art, or Margaret, or Emily, or ... If we limit our understanding and use of the notion of "Prophet" as reciting by word or action, a specific message given by an angel or other "messenger form God, or even from God, then I suggest we might have too narrow of an understanding of who and what a "true" prophet is made. Walter Bruggemann, a prominent and well-read Protestant Scripture scholar, writes about the notions and functions of the Prophet in his book, The Prophetic Imagination. In the very beginning of his book Mr. Bruggemann identifies "The dominant conservative misconception, evident in manifold bumper stickers, is that the prophet is a fortune-teller, a predictor of things to come..." (Page 2) If this is the only image we are capable of understanding, then we do not genuinely understand true prophesy. The "true prophet" is one who is in communion with God and tells the "heart of God", that as Abraham Heschel writes : "Indeed the main task of prophetic thinking is to be able to bring the world into divine focus... The prophet is endowed with the insight that enables him to say, not I love or I condemn, but God loves or God condemns." (The Prophets, page 24) A correct prophetic vision is not what we "see" but understanding how and what God sees.

In Moses' final preparations for Israel to enter into their heritage, at the end of the forty-year trek through the desert, he cautions them from following after "false prophets". The "false prophet" is any person who attempts to redirect devotion away from God to some other false god. (Deut 13) The false gods are not limited to the Baal's or Ashtoreth's, but the gods of greed, self-centeredness and self-interest, the god of accommodation. The false prophet is anyone who tries to divide humanity into "definable groups" – Conservative / Liberal; Pro-Life / Pro-Choice (the intrinsic evil of abortion is in the act, not the person alone) Wealthy / Poor; Labor / Management. Not one single human person chooses the circumstances of their birth, and not one single person is more or less loved by God. Whoever sows seeds of separation, sows weeds.

SUNDAY APRIL 29 Timothy Awards SUNDAY MAY 6 WWJD Awards w/dinner If you read the bulletin in the Christian Service section a few weeks ago, you saw that St. Isidore adopted a stream, that portion of the North Branch of the Clinton River south of 32 Mile Rd, west of Romeo Plank just off the Pine Valley Golf Course.

April 21, a Saturday, at the CRWC office on Auburn, we will be attending a class on identifying aquatic insects. This helps biologists determine the health of the stream by which insects are found and which are not found.

The following is from the Clinton River Watershed Council: The Clinton River Watershed Council's Adopt-a-Stream program is a volunteer-based program that empowers community members to protect local streams and rivers by monitoring their health. Volunteers are trained, teamed up, assigned stream sites, given equipment, data sheets, and a collection protocol, and then sent out to gather information on streamside habitats, physical characteristics and benthic macroinvertebrate populations. Twice a year – May and October – teams of trained volunteers visit their adoption site and collect data. After the initial 3 hour training session each volunteer dedicates approximately 3-4 hours of their time per year. As you can see, the commitment to this worthy endeavor is not a lot of time and is a tremendous help in cleaning up our waterways, providing recreational opportunities for all of us. If you are interested in nature or biology this would be a great taste of that field!

If you are interested in helping, please call the office, and if I'm not available, leave your name and number and I will get back to you. We will be cleaning the river in the next month and sign update will be out soon! Peace,






