This is a group that is increasing and rapidly growing in our country; a sad fact that weights our attention and deserves our very best efforts to reverse the trend and bring them home.

THE PEOPLE ARE THE CHURCH – we must GO AND FIND IT; the "real" Church is out there in the lives of the people who are not in the pews. Our duty is to locate these people and discover CHURCH in their hub. Here, we need to help one another to recognize who these folks are: our own family members, relatives and friends; and there are many others beside these people. How can we reach them and what kind of witnessing we offer to let them feel that they belong!

Our three Pillars – (Connect-Reach-Build) continue to convey the story of what is happening to us right now; what we are learning, and what we now appreciate about cultivating a healthy and vibrant parish. A simple fact clarifies the parish life's drawback: One in three persons raised in the Catholic Church has walked away from the Church, making "former Catholic" the third largest religious description in the world. Can we fix it? Perhaps, yes. Do we miss the real point? Is the problem cultural? Is it just a PARISH SETBACK? It involves about discipleship and evangelization: awakening the faithful, reaching the lost, making church matter, making them in love with the Church that they don't love any longer.

We at St. Isidore are purposely adapting that picture with our eventual enhancements and innovations. We will be eventually improving our current facilities and improve some parts of our church: state-of-the-art strategy in our gathering space, strategic increase in giving, more volunteers, and added momentum and passion in our ministry. More importantly, there is much evidence of an alive, authentically Catholic, and spiritual transformation of our parish at St. Isidore; all with God's grace in upgrading to a nourishing parish. Our commission is to reenergize one another in order to create a path to help the "unchurched" at home again. Part of the task is accompanying both parishioners and newcomers to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ: that is rebuilding and reevangelizing the culture of our parish and make church matter.

MARY, our Blessed Mother is the Queen of Evangelization. The month May is when we honor her as our Mother and Patroness of the Mission. We ask her to help us fulfill this mission of discipleship and evangelization which her Son, Jesus has given to his Church and which falls to us. As we join the celebration of MARY'S CROWNING THIS WEEKEND we entrust ourselves to her in the work of carrying the Gospel ever deeper into the hearts and lives of all the people in our parish. We entrust to her our missionary mandate and commit our cause totally to her prayers.

#### THE ART OF FINE TUNING

**DEACON BILL** 

We do not have Cable TV at home. We are still dependent on an antenna for our TV reception. For us, it works because we do not spend a lot of time watching TV, and paying for Cable to watch an hour or two of TV a week just isn't worth it. Still, we get to watch some re-runs of old programing from when Joyce and I were kids (METV 4.3) A frequent scenario employed in many situation comedies (sit-coms for the more "modern") was a busy man working at a desk and receives a call from his wife. The viewer never hears clearly the wife's conversation, but we are led to believe that it follows a familiar train as the man puts the phone receiver on his desk and occasionally picks it up to say into it: "Uh huh, yes dear" and puts the receiver back on the desk to continue what he was doing before. In real life, I think this scenario plays on a very common human experience: We hear things so often that we just tune them out.

I am sure that all of you are just like me, who as a teen ager hung intently on every word coming from our parents, especially if they were offering corrective suggestions. [Forgive me Father, I have sinned, I just told a lie, a really big one.] I am equally sure that every married person listens with the greatest attention to the insights directed toward "improvement" offered by their spouse. Or, perhaps not! It is a suspicion of mine that we have the capacity to listen to compliments with far greater attention than we have for challenges to our words, thoughts or behavior. It could be that I am simply extrapolating something that occurs within me, and expanding it into the broader community. However, I do not believe that I am. I believe that we humans have a very finely developed ability to "tune out" the noise of challenges to our opinions and claims upon our time and resources. I believe that we are also all struggling with the tensions between what really needs to be done and what we want to do.

So, given the belief that there will be a "number" of readers saying: "Oh, here we go again...", I am compelled to reiterate the belief that it is absolutely imperative that we "fine tune" our minds to distinguish truth from the static of worldly opinions. This is not especially true if we are Christians, but equally true for everyone. It is not a correct belief to suppose that "morality is a personal opinion." The question of morality will always involve a community of persons (even if only two). Yet, we are daily exposed to the constant din of public opinions promoting the irrational belief that; morality is a personal opinion; social norms are to be scorned; success is measured in dollars; and safety is to be found in suspecting "others" of evil intent. Rather than listen to the pull of God's love, we turn up the volume of social media, our "R" rated movies and games that comfort us into the euphoric stupor of self-indulgence.

#### **RIGHT TO LIFE**

Knights of Columbus Michigan State Council and Right to Life of Michigan Educational Fund held the Respect Life 40thAnnual Benefit Dinner on April 5th. The keynote speaker was Melissa Ohden, founder of the Abortion Survivors Network. Melissa told her story of being a baby that survived a saline infusion abortion in 1977. She was born at 31 weeks, and had initial health complications, but she stood before us a perfectly normal, healthy and beautiful woman. Melissa had been adopted by a loving, happy family. She later searched for her biological parents after obtaining a copy of her medical records. She wanted them to know that she was alive and well, happy and healthy, and not bitter but grateful to be alive. She had no ill will toward either of her biological parents or their families for the circumstances that surrounded her birth and adoption. She was able to connect with her biological paternal grandfather and aunt (who didn't even know she existed). though her birth father had passed away before Melissa had an opportunity to meet him. She was also able to connect with her birthmother and her two half-sisters and her birth mother's cousin. She discovered that her birth mother did not want the saline abortion but was forced to have it by her mother who happened to be a nurse. Her birth mother wasn't told that her baby had survived the abortion. Melissa is convinced that she survived her abortion to be the voice for the voicelessand their mothers. She is an advocate for women, men and children impacted by abortion. You can read about Melissa's story in her book, You Carried Me. (youcarriedmebook.com, melissaohden.com) Melissa Ohden's Respect Life presentation was video recorded and a DVD was ordered. It will be available for our parishioners to view at a later date.
