





#### CONVENTION OF THOUGHT

"Convention" is one of those words in the English language that has a different meaning depending on the context of its use. For some people, a "convention" is where delegates travel to a different city, where they wear identifying nametags, they party all night,.... Sorry, get to bed early so to be attentive and alert for those interesting meetings and presentations. Another use of the word "convention" deals with the concept of an accepted rule of thought or behavior; conventional behaviors have men to stand when being introduced to another person (especially a woman); conventional thought or wisdom says that wealth is better than poverty. Either use of CONVENTION is not a specific negative concept. At trade shows and conventions, ideas are shared, friendships and networks are formed and business relationships born. Conventional behaviors are the basics of human socializations.

While "conventions" serve a fundamental social and economic need, being a "slave" to convention can be a very dangerous approach to either human society or business. I imagine that by now, most people are familiar with the term "thinking out of the box". The "box" being the traditional or conventional way a "problem or situation" is addressed or resolved. I imagine that much of the tremendous leaps we have made in technology are a direct result of "thinking out of the box". We, here at St. Isidore, are trying to "think out of the box" as we promote the idea of "church" through our Connect - Reach - Build. The genuine strength of a church is not in the doctrines taught, but the depth of connection to a community experienced by the members. The "cults of the 60's and 70's were dynamic communities even though their theology was deeply suspicious. The Catholic Church has a deep and rich theology, but conventional thoughts and behaviors have reduced the idea of "church", in the minds of many, to be a barter system. If though, we should really connect with others regardless of the differences in circumstances, reach out to people in need simply because that is who we are, we will absolutely build a strong, vibrant and active community here at St. Isidore.

However, attempts to refashion the "conventions" of "what we have always done before" into a fresh idea of what we need to do now; will always be met with resistance (not necessarily a bad thing). This is no different today I would imagine than it has been for any period in human history. Certainly in Jesus' time and for the early church, the Jews resisted with dramatic force the non-conventional responses to life proposed by this "Jesus of Nazareth". The "convention" of Jewish law and ritual was a convention of separation. Kosher was kept separate from non-kosher, meat was kept separate from dairy, clean from un-clean and circumcised from everyone else. Jesus introduced (actually reinforced the consistent message of prophets) - God's all-inclusive mercy. The Jews of ancient history resisted this idea of God's ways and throughout the history of the Church, the resistance hasn't changed. In God's Law of Love, there is no qualification of nationality, economic power, or ethnicity. As Christians, we need to ask ourselves -why is there in our love?

### MARIAN BANNER

The Marian Banner came about while a parishioner was praying at morning Mass in July of 2017 after many months of prayer. While praving for a special intention the thought came to her that if the praver was answered a banner would be made to honor our Mother. The praver was answered on October 17, 2017. The vision of the banner started to develop after research was done on the attributes associated with the Virgin Mary. The colors of blue, gold and white come from the St. Isidore statue of our beloved Mother who is adorned with the same colors. There are 12-8 pointed stars in all to represent the 12-8 pointed stars on the crown of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The banner has 11 on the front and 1 on the back which has the label inscribed with "In thanksgiving for an answered prayer on October 17, 2017". It also has the date the banner was completed - April 12, 2018. The attribute of vines are in the white fabric around the stars and the floral fabric on the small border and on the back represent the attribute of flowers. The large stars are positioned in the center of the banner for 2 reasons: the first to lead your eyes downward to rest on the Virgin Mary, and the second is to lead your eyes from the Virgin Mary upward to heaven. The banner was made to recognize and honor the beloved Mother and the help she gave when asked to pray with the parishioner and for her prayer intercession for the intention. The parishioner is extremely grateful for the blessing that was given to her and her family.
