We are also doing a few things a bit different at this Mass. In order to create a more informal setting, (one conducive for 5:30 Sunday evening after a busy weekend), we have not had an entrance procession: the ministers simply join the assembly at the front of the church for the beginning of Mass. The ordained ministers also sit in the front pew for the Liturgy of the Word, allowing us an opportunity to be more directly attentive to Sacred Scripture, and not separated from the assembly. We will evaluate these practices as we move forward. We invite your feedback. Please spread the news of the Sunday Night Mass.

### WHAT COMES FIRST?

*Continued from last week*

Christianity is not about being "perfect" human beings. Christianity is about making sincere efforts to align our thoughts, words and actions with the teachings and love of Jesus the Christ. A genuineness of a Christian spirit needs to seek a correct understanding of the "heart" of Jesus, the "heart" of God and direct its own "heart" to model Jesus'. I am convinced that this is the absolute goal of Christianity; the "First" of many firsts. I look at the world around me and get frustrated, frightened, and angry at the level of violence and hatred in our world. Yet, if there is sincerity in my heart to work toward a more just, charitable and merciful world, then I must first look at my own heart and admit that it is imperfect. My heart needs healing! I need to admit that some (maybe most) of my words, thoughts and activities violate the very principles which are closest and dearest in the heart of God and Christ. Until I first admit that my heart needs it, it can never be healed.

I am not of the opinion that we will be able to successfully find examples of "contrite" hearts, looking for health and forgiveness, if we look for it in Hollywood or Washington. I am of the opinion that too many people pay more attention the "who says" than "what is said". I believe that it is a "story" rather than an "historical fact" that sin entered the world when Adam and Eve ate from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil (Gen. 3). Yet, whether fable or "good history", the point is made that sin entered the world through a human activity. And, what was the first human response to being "caught"? – It's not my fault she (or he, or they, or whatever) made me do it; or I was deceived... I do not doubt that deception was the central motivator (the Devil is the master of lies), but the deception was not that they would know as much as God, or even that they "would not die". The deception I believe, was that "they could handle it" (the true knowledge of good and evil). Listen to a person addicted to alcohol, drugs, pornography, etc. who refuses intervening help: "I can handle it myself!" Yet, we know that it is not true. Addictions are rarely successfully overcome through any "self-help" protocol. Of all the different "interventions" I have looked at, the ones that seem to have the highest success rate are those which involve a process and a community. The process builds the discipline and the community provides the accountability.

Whether it be our politicians, public heroes (media, sports, music,...) a common disclaimer seems to be accountability. Everything that is wrong in this world is "THEIR" fault and if EVERYBODY would LISTEN TO ME, then life would be perfect. I believe that the only person who could legitimately say that, is Jesus. We need to admit that we are a part of what is wrong in this world. We need to focus on our own failures to live according to God's universal and unfathomable love. We cannot legitimately think we can do this apart from being part of a faith community, and a willingness to change.
