We need not give up coffee or the paper, but if God is a genuine priority in our life, a couple of things do not really have to be done "today or else."

We offer that GIFT to you! Our Evening Mass at our Parish on Sunday at 5:30 is one of our "try-outs" as Parish to experiment change or endeavoring some new flavors for our busy Catholics. Choosing a Church or place to celebrate Mass is of some importance, too. Experimenting with time to go to Mass can be spiritually fun; perhaps our 5:30 Sunday evening Mass can be enjoyable for you, as well!

A DANGEROUS ROAD

In many past articles, I have mentioned that differences between Catholic teaching and Protestant teachings are not that great a divide. This is not a recant of those articles, but recognition that there are some major differences, and some that I fear are even dangerous to the Gospel of Love, and to human society. A most prominent could be the teaching on "predestination", of the Calvinists Presbyterians.

Calvin described the basis of predestination in several ways. In general he affirmed that there is no basis for election outside of God. Referring to Eph. 1.9, Calvin noted that God purposed election "in Himself," basing his decree of predestination on "nothing outside Himself (192)." Calvin attributed the salvation of the elect to God's free decision to favor them (188). He variously described this as God's "mere generosity (180, 187)," his "freely given mercy (189, 195, 211)," and the "good pleasure of His will (191; cf. Eph. 1.5)." Moreover, Calvin based the damnation of the reprobate solely in God's decision (189, 200).

I see a grave danger to human society to adopt the tenants of God's Predestination as an unquestionable law. In adopting an attitude of being predestined can lead to holding the idea that God controls everything, and the poor are poor because God wants them that way; the rich are rich because God wants it that way. I do not see that it is a "long step" to move from an ideology of predestination to an ideology of elitism; a separation from the difficulties facing others because they are by predesign or genetics, less than oneself. I see the backbone of racism and bigotry, injustice and oppression of people as taking to heart that some people are naturally superior to others and thus deserve everything they can acquire. Elitism discounts the value of the work of others who's "job" is "less important – more manual" – than one's own work. Elitism discredits the rights of others to seek the same rights and privileges they enjoy.

Of course, in today's world, we don't want to be called an "elitist" that has too many negative connotations. Instead, we tend to hide behind the rhetoric of "nationalism", "capitalism", or have "earned" our economic status. I recognize in myself a tendency to forget sometimes how much I have is related to special advantages I have received. I did not choose to be born here in the U. S., to a white middle-class family, have access to a descent education and a family that supported the value of education. Yes I believe that I worked hard to earn my paychecks, I worked hard to improve my knowledge and education, but I also see that I still owe a great deal to good fortune.

In the framework of elitism there is little room for others. Yes, there can be great philanthropy, but lacking a genuine respect for others as an equal – Look at me, I'm doing this for them! Aren't I a wonderful person? Read Matthew 6:1-4 Predestination discounts Free will and Elitism denies true Christian charity and love.
