



WERE THE NAZIS WRONG? OR, JUST AHEAD OF THEIR TIME?

I can appreciate the offensiveness of inferring that people who support the allowance for abortion are in some way members of a Nazi party. Throughout human history, there seems to be the everpresent tension between the ways of society, the norms of government and the way of faith. The citizens of Germany in the 1930's, as the citizens of Russia in the 1930's, were in much of the same predicament as the citizens of ancient Rome in the first century, you are either a "loyal" citizen, or you are a "threat". In the ancient Roman Empire, the Communist party, and the Nazi Party, there were some very evil persons. However, I also imagine that there were far more people who were "members" as a means of survival more than acceptance of an ideology. Once the power of the Emperor, Chairman, the Fuhrer is established, it can be crucial to one's survival not to be counted as a "threat" to their society. Thus, I am going to suggest that those same voters who voted Adolf Hitler, Chancellor of Germany in 1933 had no idea of the death Camps to come. I am going to suggest that these voters were just trying to make Germany Great Again.

Some people have bought into the idea that to create a "perfect" society, a "supreme race", an evolutional program of genetics, and destruction of disordered persons needed to be enacted. (This idea – in rough form – came out of the genetic arguments for forced sterilizations in America.) Once a person accepts the idea that "perfect societies" can be created by creating "perfect persons" through genetic selection, then life loses its right to existence and becomes a matter of property. The idea of "supremacy/perfection suggests that the person becomes a slave to the state, and has no value outside is ability to serve the state. When most people take the time to actually think about the validity of Hitler's Final Solution, the extermination of all "inferior" races, repugnance overwhelms the soul. Yet, in our culture's fascination with the concept of a "perfect society, free of disturbance" we are steadily moving toward a repeat of the horrors of Auschwitz.

Not only will America never be great, the world will only become darker as long as people of "good will" tolerate the attitude that life is a privilege for some and not the right of all. However, when I refer to "LIFE" I am referring to an aspect much larger than the mere birth of a person; I am referring to every aspect of life that impacts every person's wellbeing. The fundamental dignity of every human being is not a function of one's nationality, one's ethnicity, nor is it a function of one's gender. The value of personhood is not measured by an ability to "contribute" but completely in its existence in God's love. Until we as a nation, a people of God can embrace the right of every person to food, education, meaningful employment, healthcare, a living wage, respect, and security, we will continue on a path toward atrocity in the name of elusive "greatness".

ADORATION CHAPEL



EUCHARISTIC ADORATION TIME AND LOCATION CHANGE

As Vatican II taught, the Eucharist is "the source and summit of Christian life" (Lumen Gentium,11), most prominently at the Mass, of course, but also in Eucharistic Adoration. What Can be more important? (hprweb.com.June2018)

The Worship Commission and the Parish Leadership Team would like to make you aware of changes to the Eucharist Exposition and Adoration Chapel hours and location.

Beginning July 10, 2018, the Chapel will move to a more suitable location in the Resource Center (by the Rosary Garden entrance), near the beautiful stained-glass window depicting the Eucharist. This worship area will be available on Tuesdays from immediately following the 8 a.m. morning Mass until closing Benediction, which will begin at 6 p.m.

There will no longer be Adoration hours on Wednesday and Thursday. The Holy Hour before morning Mass on Tuesdays and Fridays, which includes Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 7 a.m. to the beginning of Mass, remains unchanged.

There need be no formal format to private Eucharistic Adoration. Say the Rosary or your favorite prayers, read scripture, talk to the Lord and share your burdens, or just sit in His presence and let Him speak to you. Feel free to stop in anytime; spend a few minutes or an hour, or, if you would like to sign up as a regular Adorer during any time period for the Tuesday hours there is a signup form at www.stlsidore.church/adoration-chapel or contact the office at 586-286-1700.



Thanks to CSA gifts, the Youth Ministry Office is able to provide presentations like these to foster the spiritual and personal growth of archdiocesan youth.






