Hydration in Summer

It is important for your body to have plenty of fluids each day for hydration. Water helps you digest food, absorb nutrients, and rid the body of waste. It is especially important to drink fluids when exercising to replace lost fluids. Check with your doctor if you have limits on how much to drink daily.

The following are tips to stay hydrated:

- Drink a glass of water before you exercise or go outside to garden or walk, especially on a hot day.
- Drink fat-free or low-fat milk, or other drinks without added sugars.
- Remember, water is a good way to add fluids to your daily routine without adding calories.
- Drink a full glass of water if you need to take a pill.
- Don't stop drinking liquids if you have a urinary control problem. Talk with your doctor about treatment.

A CHRISTIAN RESPONSE TO IMMIGRATION

A point of clarification: *When the Catholic Church teaches, She Teaches ALL Peoples, regardless of denomination or sect.*

It might be a human trait to excuse oneself from the conversation if it is perceived that the speaker is obviously talking to another person. I believe that most non-Catholics automatically discount the "Teachings of the Church" as not applicable to them because they are not Catholic. Unfortunately, there are many Catholics who seem to have adopted a "cafeteria mentality" of picking and choosing which teachings they "believe" (or like) and which teachings they disregard (dislike). Personally, there are a number of teachings of the Church that I do not fully understand, in concept or context, but I willing and fully admit that it is a shortcoming in my education, thought and prayer. I absolutely believe that Christ established the Church, in Peter and the through the Apostolic succession (Mtt 16:18-19; Is 22:15-24) and the Church has the power, through Christ's authority to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you..." (c.f. Mtt 28:18-20; Mk 18:15-16; Lk 24:44-49; Jn 20:21-23, 21:15-19)

Church's social doctrine is not a privilege for her, nor a digression, a convenience or interference: it is her right to proclaim the Gospel in the context of society, to make the liberating word of the Gospel resound in the complex worlds of production, labor, business, finance, trade, politics, law, culture, social communications, where men and women live.
USCCB/LEV. Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church p 31

Contrary to the popular notion of subjectivism, truth is a universal reality, regardless of a person's ability to perceive. I have frequently remarked in various articles that "truth" is not dependent upon what a person "believes", but that truth is a self-sustained reality humans are challenged to discover. Thus, if the Church is commissioned by Christ to speak the Truth in His Name, through His authority, then that truth is applicable to all nations for all time and culture. And here, I must pause to forward a distinction between what is a teaching, and what is legislation. The "Teaching" of the Church is an understanding of a "revealed truth". The "Legislation" of the Church is a practice that correctly responds to the "teaching". the Church teaches that all people have a responsibility to the poor.

"182. The principle of the universal destination of goods requires that the poor, the marginalized and in all cases those whose living conditions interfere with their proper growth should be the focus of particular concern. To this end, the preferential option for the poor should be reaffirmed in all its force.384..."
USCCB/LEV. Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church p 79

The practicalities of how societies are to facilitate this teaching can change throughout history and cultures, but the fundamental reality of the teaching is universal and unchangeable.

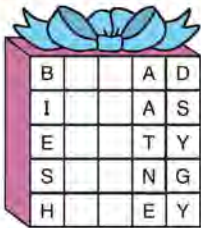

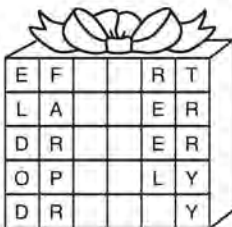
