PARISH SECURITY UPDATE

It has been a while since we've updated you on what we are doing to keep our parishioners, parish and staff as safe as we possibly can.

One of the changes we are implementing is that after 4:00 pm each day, the door to the Social Hall will be locked. If you have business anywhere in the Social Hall or the back hall where rooms 9 & 10 are, the Youth Room, kitchen or maintenance area, you must sign in at the reception desk with your name, phone number, time and purpose of your visit. Once you have completed your business, you must return to the desk and sign out. There are no exceptions! Also, unused rooms in the complex will be locked as well and you must sign in at the desk if you anticipate using a meeting room. This is intended for those who may be volunteering for some activity that is not ongoing. Those who belong to a group, commissions, etc., and are here for their regular meetings are not affected by these new procedures.

Most schools and businesses have instituted these general procedures for the safety of their students and/or employees and we feel this also is a good idea for the safety of St. Isidore Parish as well.

PRAYER BLANKET MINISTRY

We ask that you keep us in your prayers as we try to reach those who need comfort and benefit from a blanket or shawl. Other ways you can help:

1. Join our crochet/knit group. We meet on Thursdays @ 11:00, usually in the social hall.
2. Make prayer lap blankets (or shawls) and donate them during office hours. Any type lap blanket with no fringe is acceptable: crochet, knit, fleece, quilted, etc. Fleece needs to be stitched or bordered, not tied. Shawls can be rectangular or triangular.
3. Donate money for yarn and fabric so we can purchase materials to make our lap blankets and shawls.

Please get one of our prayer blankets or shawls **free of charge** in the St. Isidore office for a person you know who needs comfort because of a medical, emotional, or spiritual crisis in their life.

ADORATION CHAPEL

Starting October 2, there will no longer be a Holy Hour before morning Mass on Tuesdays. Since there is adoration and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament every Tuesday immediately following morning Mass through to 6:00 pm and ending with Benediction, the Holy Hour before Mass will be discontinued.

Holy Hour before morning Mass on Fridays will continue as usual.

If you have not yet visited the Adoration Chapel (newly relocated to the Resource Center) on Tuesdays please consider doing so.

There is no formal format to private Eucharistic Adoration. Say the Rosary or your favorite prayers, read scripture, talk to the Lord and share your burdens, or just sit in His presence and let Him speak to you.

Feel free to stop in anytime during this very holy time of exposition; spend a few minutes or an hour. In this hectic and busy world, wouldn't it be nice to spend some quiet time with the Lord!

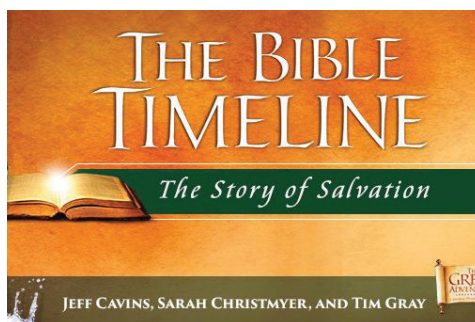
SMALL GROUPS

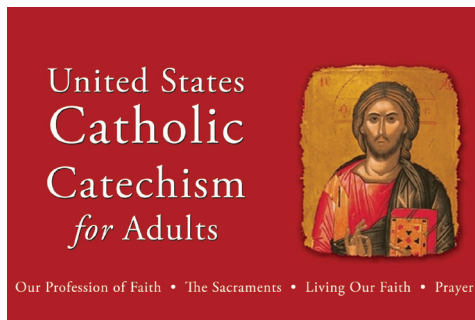
