LETTER FROM FR. RON

St. Isidore faithful,

We have all been affected, in one way or another, by the horrible sexual abuse scandals of the Catholic Church. The news is disturbing, and for many of us, incomprehensible. Back in August, I wrote a letter to the parish communicating my feelings on how the St. Isidore community has addressed the scandal. I'm writing to you today to inform you of two events, one an opportunity for dialogue and transparency, the other, an opportunity for further vigilance against this issue.

On October 25, 2018, we will be offering an open forum regarding the recently surfaced abuses within the Church. The session will begin at 7 PM in the social hall, and we will plan on wrapping up no later than 8:30 PM. Our time together will include prayer, discussion and information. Additionally, we will have round table discussions. All adults are invited to attend this session.

On November 10, 2018, we will be offering a Protecting God's Children seminar. St. Isidore is recommitting itself to providing an environment where it is nearly impossible for these type of horrific abuses to occur. With that said, we need everyone's assistance. Staff and most of our key volunteers have already attended a Protecting God's Children seminar and have a Criminal Background Check on record. This session is being offered to anyone who has yet to fulfill this requirement. This offering is free and usually lasts about 3-hours. The program will begin at 9 AM and end at roughly 12 PM. A light meal will be served at 8:30 AM. Anyone who is interested in making St. Isidore the safest environment possible for all our visitors, parishioners, and friends, should attend this training.

As stated in my homily shortly after the story in Pennsylvania came to light, we are asking our parish members to "Lead, not Leave" the Church. Please plan on attending the open forum and this training; encourage everyone you know to be part of a vigilant parish body that is working to make sure that something like this will not occur here at St. Isidore.

World Mission Sunday, our annual worldwide Eucharistic celebration for the Missions and missionaries of the world, will be on October 21. This collection on the next-to-last Sunday in October is a unique, global effort for the entire Church to provide for the building up of over one thousand local churches in Asia and Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe. Through the work of these churches, and their witness to Christ, the poor receive practical help and experience God's love and mercy, His hope and peace.

Using various languages during liturgy and singing songs in various languages helps remind us that we are part of a greater worshipping community. As the Body of Christ, we are members of a global church.

The Body of Christ includes all cultures and ethnicities throughout the world. Our hymnal includes music in some of these languages to remind us that on any given Sunday, we are not just praying with our fellow parishioners here in the pews, we are also celebrating Mass with our Catholic brothers and sisters in Africa, Asia, Europe, South and Central America. All are welcome in the the family of God. The reality of our specific demographic here at St. Isidore is that we do have many Spanish-Speaking people in our community who for whom English is not the first language. For those who are seeking a parish home of belonging, singing a song or refrain or verse in the language most familiar to them can be the warm embrace of our welcome and prayer together. There is great comfort praying in our most familiar tongue. The power of our "welcome" is also greater when we are willing to share our worship through our rich heritage and the cultural diversity of all of God's people.

Ultimately, our call as Catholic Christians is to "go forth and make of all disciples". If singing in someone else's language can help make a stranger feel welcomed at Mass, comfortable in prayer, closer to Jesus, and a part of our community, then this is a small sacrifice to live out our Gospel call in a significant way!

Flu Prevention Tips

Believe it or not, cold and flu season is quickly approaching. Now is the time to start thinking about prevention. There are some pointers to help you get through the season.

- **Get vaccinated***
The vaccine is designed to protect against the flu strains health experts believe will be most common during that year's flu season.
- **Wash your hands**
Wash them with soap and water. When soap and water are not available use an alcohol based hand sanitizer. It's the easiest, yet vital preventative measure you can take.
- **Don't touch your face**
Germ spread this way
- **Limit your contact**
*Avoid contact with sick people and if you are sick, limit your contact with others
Stay home for a full 24 hours after your fever goes away from a flu-like illness*
- **Smile**
Studies show that smiling (and laughing) can boost your immunity
- **Eat right**
Eating healthy, balanced meals can strengthen your immune system
- **Exercise**
Exercise also boosts your immune system and speeds the recovery from illness

*For your convenience, pharmacists from Rite-Aid Pharmacy will be here at St. Isidore on Saturday, October 13 and Sunday, October 14 providing Flu-shots. They will be able to bill Medicare and private insurances. The price for the flu-shot is \$34.99 and does contain the quad-dose (4 strains of the flu virus). They will also have the high-dose flu shot as well as the pneumonia shot available for seniors. Please bring your immunization card with you if you have one.


