FR. RON'S RAMBLINGS

November is the month dedicated to remembering and praying for the Faithful Departed, our brothers and sisters who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. If you have not as yet done so, please enter departed loved ones' names in our Book of the Dead located near the baptismal pool. We will include all those inscribed in the book at the intercessions at daily Mass throughout the month. One of the prayers at the conclusion of the Last Farewell at a funeral liturgy is: "(Lord), in the sight of this world, (they) are now dead. In your sight, may (they) live forever!" This prayer holds before us the reality of their death, but also expresses our hope for them

At the conclusion of the funeral liturgy, a family member of the deceased places a cross inscribed with the name, date of death, and age of their loved one on the Memorial Board in the back of church. The cross remains on the board until the next All Souls' Day, November 2, when the cross is returned to the family at a

special Service of Remembrance. The board with its crosses is a reminder for us throughout the year to pray for our departed members and their families, and to offer our support to those in our parish grieving the recent loss of a loved one. It is also a reminder that the departed are still part of our parish community, joining us for prayer from their place in heaven. Death cannot separate us from God's love, or from our love for each other.

This is a good opportunity to acknowledge and thank those of our parish community who are part of our grief ministry, supporting families at the time of death. This includes those who lead Wake Services at the funeral home on the eve of the funeral; the members of our Funeral Luncheon teams, the adults who serve Funeral Masses and coordinate the involvement of family in the service, and members of our Resurrection Choir. These wonderful people are always called upon to serve with little notice, and represent our entire parish in comforting those who grieve. We also thank the staffs of our local Funeral Homes who serve our families with great dedication.

CONNECTING POINT

How can I do small things with great love?

Are we naturally creatures of responsive love or are we reactionary creatures of a variety of emotional responses good, bad and ugly?

Habitual responses can be difficult to break especially in intense situations. Old habits of responding out of our irritations and frustrations can die hard unless we make intentional choices to change our negative responses to others.

The Jamaicans have a favorite saying of mine that often helps me to remember to stay chill with others when things get sticky: "No problem, mon; only situation."

Not all of us all have the means or ability to be genuine saints like Mother Teresa (from whose quote our Connecting Point is inspired), but each one of us can work to improve the ways we respond to others especially in sticky situations.

The Gospel reading today, MT 5:1-12A gives us Beatitudes; a framework of positive responses through which we can respond to just about any situation with an attitude of care for the other(s).

The person driving too slowly in front of you may be "poor in spirit" because they just lost their job.

Peacemakers don't give up... even on stubborn family members or friends who won't talk anymore.

A simple act of being merciful could be giving someone a closer parking space or offering a place ahead in line at the store.

In a dark world of conflicting messages and situations, we can all choose to be more intentional in responding to others out of love rather than out of our darker alternatives.

Incidentally, if you replace the first letter "N" of November with "L", you have created a whole new meaning with one small change. Paying it forward can begin with the choice one person makes.

Live the "Be-attitudes".

Grief and the Holidays

The Holidays are quickly approaching, and for most, they are the "most wonderful time of the year"! But for others who are grieving the loss of a loved one, the holidays can be extremely difficult. Holidays mark the passage of time in our lives. They are part of the milestones we share with each other and they generally represent time spent with family. They bring meaning to certain days and we bring much meaning back to them. But since holidays are for being with those we love the most, how on earth can anyone be expected to cope with them when a loved one has died? For many people, this is the hardest part of grieving, when we miss our loved ones even more than usual. How can you celebrate togetherness when there is none? When you have lost someone special, your world loses its celebratory qualities. Holidays only magnify the loss. The sadness feels sadder and the loneliness goes deeper. The need for support may be the greatest during the holidays. You can and will get through the holidays. Rather than avoiding the feelings of grief, lean into them. It is not the grief you want to avoid, it is the pain. Grief is the way out of the pain. Grief is our internal feeling and mourning is our external expressions.

Ways to externalize the loss - give it a time and a place

- Say a prayer before the Holiday dinner, about your loved one.
- Light a candle for your loved one.
- Create an online tribute for them.
- Share a favorite story about your loved one.
- Have everyone tell a funny story about your loved one.
- Here at church, remember them in a prayer.
- · Chat online about them.

Do's and Don'ts

- · Do be gentle with yourself and protect yourself.
- Don't do more than you want, and don't do anything that does not serve your soul and your loss.
- Do allow time for the feelings.
- Don't keep feelings bottled up. If you have 500 tears to cry don't stop at 250.

- Do allow others to help. We all need help at certain times in our lives.
- Don't ask if you can help or should help a friend in grief.
 Just help. Find ways; invite them to group events or just out for coffee.
- Do, in grief, pay extra attention to the children. Children are too often the forgotten grievers.

Ways to Cope

Have a Plan A/Plan B – Plan A is you go to the Thanksgiving, Christmas Day or Christmas Eve dinner with family and friends. If it doesn't feel right, have your plan B ready. Plan B may be a movie you both liked or a photo album to look through or a special place you went to together. Many people find that when they have Plan B in place, just knowing it is there is enough.

Cancel the Holiday all together. Yes, you can cancel the Holiday. If you are going through the motions and feeling nothing, cancel them. Take a year off. They will come around again. For others, staying involved with the Holidays is a symbol of life continuing. Let the Holiday routine give you a framework during these tough times.

Try the Holidays in a new way. Grief has a unique way of giving us the permission to really evaluate what parts of the Holidays you enjoy and what parts you don't. Remember, there is no right or wrong way to handle the Holidays in grief. You have to decide what is right for you and do it. You have every right to change your mind, even a few times. Friends and family members may not have a clue how to help you through the Holidays and you may not either.

It is very natural to feel you may never enjoy the Holidays again. They will certainly never be the same as they were. However, in time, most people are able to find meaning again in the traditions as a new form of the Holiday Spirit grows inside of them. Even without grief, our friends and relatives often think they know how our Holidays should look, what "the family" should and shouldn't do.
