

Two characteristic features of Jesus' preaching are closely related. (1) He calls God his father. Because Jesus took on our human condition, we too are drawn into this divine relationship, so that we can also say Our Father, or more accurately, "abba," meaning daddy." (2) Jesus teaches us to become like little children in order to enter the reign of God, the kingdom.

Both of these teachings were unique to Jesus. No one in the Hebrew/ Jewish tradition dared to call God by such a familial term as "father," much less "daddy." It was only with fear and trembling that they approached God.

Speaking of children in glowing terms was also quite unusual in ancient times. The thinking then was that children should be seen and not heard. Thus, Jesus' disciples tried to shoo the children away, before Jesus said, "Let them come to me." For Jesus, children model for us humility and dependence on God. They are the vulnerable ones, much like the poor and handicapped. And most especially,

they are the ones who are not jaded, who take delight in everything. In one passage, (Mt 11:16-17) Jesus even describes children playing pretend weddings and funerals.

Of course, at Christmas time we reflect on Jesus, the son of God who made himself so vulnerable as to be born into poverty. And we think of our own children and grandchildren who are so excited about Christmas.

Three simple experiences I had during this Advent/ Christmas season reminded me of my own "inner child." First, our staff had a meeting/ lunch at Debbie Rak's house, where I got right down on the floor and had a blast playing with her little dog. As a child I was afraid of dogs, so at moments like these, I get to experience something I missed out on as a kid.

Secondly, we have on the rectory kitchen window sill a little toy elf no taller than my finger. I had seen him since I came here in July, but hadn't thought much of him until one sunny December afternoon when I saw him come to life. He swayed to and fro, his head to one side and body to the other, and it finally dawned on me that he is solar powered. (In the summer and fall, the sun is too high in the sky for its rays to shine directly through our window.) This simple little toy probably gave me greater joy than some of the fancy Christmas toys I got when I was a child.

The third experience was when I saw our Religious Ed director Ann De Rey just before Christmas, wearing a necklace of Christmas light bulbs—the big old-fashioned ones I remember as a small child, that have come back into fashion. I said, "I love your Christmas light necklace," so she then flipped a switch behind her neck two or three times, causing the lights to flash on and off in unison, then to turn on and off in wavelike sequence, all the little tricks that Christmas lights do these days.

"Let the children come to me." "You must become like little children to enter the kingdom of God." Merry Christmas, and Happy New Year.

CONNECTING POINT

How does my family support each other in times of stress?

Most families manage well in times of anxiety and stress. Daily expressions of love can overcome most anything. The first place people go when under some stress is to prayer. I mean not only structured prayer (the rosary, for example), but also conversational prayer.

One of my favorite saints is St. Anthony, (the patron saint of lost things!) I just talk with him, reminding him that I count on him to intercede for me to God. Prayer can be a valuable part of family life. In all the stressful situations, we teach by word and example the value of prayer in our daily lives. Some prayer at night, at meals, or when leaving on vacation, are ways of including prayer in family life.

Family is the school of faith and the place we find God in the ordinary everyday world.

*If pledges are paid in full, this money will be returned to the parish in full. Additionally, this money will not be part of future CSA calculations, nor will it be part of the AOD assessment.
