FR. RON'S RAMBLINGS

It is a long tradition in the Church of having special "intentions" for a Mass. The special intention is usually a deceased loved one, or someone in special need of the graces of a Mass. As you have noticed, we at St. Isidore have multiple intentions at most Masses. For instance, at weekend Masses we often have up to ten intentions (we limit the number to ten). These intentions are "announced" in this weekly bulletin, and prayed for by name during the General Intercessions at Mass.

However, multiple intentions at Mass is in violation of Canon Law and the policy of the Archdiocese of Detroit. With a few exceptions, only one such intention is allowed for each Mass. In recent months, the Archdiocese has informed us of the need to follow this policy.

We are now in the process of forming new guidelines in order to bring our parish in closer compliance with the policy of the Archdiocese. The proposed new guidelines will be brought to the Parish Pastoral Council for their review

at the February meeting. We will then make them available to parishioners once they are finalized. This will be a big adjustment for us. For example, given the size of our parish, we will have to severely limit the number of Masses each parishioner can request, as well as to set a limit as to the number of intentions for a particular, living or deceased. Stay tuned!

Last week was our annual celebration of Catholic Schools Week in the Archdiocese of Detroit. We have two excellent Catholic Schools in the Northwest Macomb Vicariate: St. Lawrence Catholic Grade School in Utica, and Austin Catholic High School on 23 Mile Road east of Fairchild. We highly recommend these schools for those wanting a Catholic school education for their children. St. Isidore is one of the founding parishes of Austin. At the approval of our Finance Council, we recently made a pledge of \$600,000.00 to an Austin capital campaign to be paid over ten years. It is vital for all of us to support our Catholic schools.

What was once limited as an occasional experience during the year is now available to us every Tuesday. Please come and partake of this wonderful gift!

The Adoration Chapel is located in the Resource Center which is just inside the handicap entrance on the Romeo Plank side of the church.

CONNECTING POINT

What spiritual gifts have I been given to share God's love?

I often take time to thank God for the gifts God has given me, and try to find ways to share those gifts with others. I thank God for the gifts of time, talent, and treasure. I then try to share those gifts.

Yet, I often seem to overlook the most valuable gifts God has given me: my spiritual gifts. We are told in our reading from I Corinthians today that love is the greatest spiritual gift. God's love is a gift we all have received, and we are called to share that gift with others. Other spiritual gifts would include compassion, gentleness, mercy, peace, fortitude, wisdom, and patience. These gifts have been given to each one of us in varying degrees: some of us have more patience or peacefulness than others. Many of the "elders" of our parish community have the gift wisdom of which we are much in need.

I believe that small children often learn to be gentle and patient through the way their grandparents are gentle and patient with them. This is just one way in which the grandparents among us can share their spiritual gifts.

God has given each of us differing spiritual gifts. Let's take some time this week to name the specific spiritual gifts God has given us, and then find ways to share those gifts. Imagine how on fire our parish would be if we all recognized and shared our spiritual gifts!

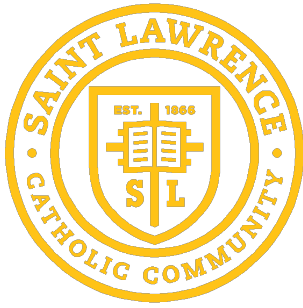

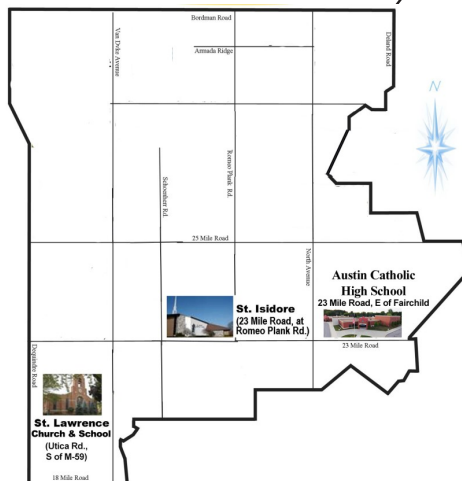

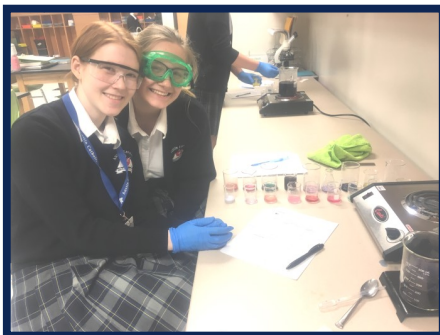

IRA ROLLOVER

Per the Archdiocese of Detroit: IRA Rollover

Over 70-and-a-half? What you need to know about the IRA charitable gift rollover.

Congress has extended and the president has signed the favorable IRA charitable rollover tax provisions for 2015 and made them permanent for future years. What should a donor over age 70½ do in order to get the benefit that IRA distributions will not be included in taxable income? Donors should follow the same general procedures for IRA charitable distributions as in the past —

- Only direct distributions to charity up to \$100,000 qualify as tax-free. Distributions in exchange for a charitable gift annuity or to a charitable remainder trust do not qualify.
- It is especially important that the IRA distribution be made payable to the charity, not to you as the IRA owner and beneficiary. Otherwise, the distribution would not qualify for the favorable tax treatment. Advise your IRA administrator to make the distribution check payable to the Church or other charity, not to you.
- Only distributions from traditional or certain Roth IRAs are tax-free; the law does not apply to other qualified retirement plans, such as 401(k) plans. However, you should consider consulting with your financial or tax advisor about the possibility of transferring funds from one of these other qualified plans to establish an IRA, with the distribution to charity coming from the newly established IRA.
- Consult with your IRA administrator and tax advisor on the proper procedures for making a direct distribution to St. Isidore, the Archdiocese of Detroit Endowment Foundation, the Catholic Services Appeal, Sacred Heart Major Seminary, Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan, or another archdiocesan institution or qualified charity.

A special note from St. Isidore: We thank the many parishioners who use this type of distribution to generously support the parish. We are blessed by this act of generosity. St. Isidore will work to the best of our ability to track IRA distributions that come directly to the parish, but most often these distributions come in anonymously. Please contact our Business Manager, Chris Kozlowski (chris@stisidore.church or 586-745-9514) with any questions on how your distribution is being recorded.



It takes a lot of ministers working together to make Mass a beautiful experience, and you see most of them in action each week: lectors, Eucharistic ministers, ushers, altar servers, and musicians. But there is one minister who you do not see each week: the person running our AV projection. We call these AV ministers, AVengers (because they are heroes!), and they are enhancing Mass behind the scenes each week.

We have come to just expect projection at every Mass and perhaps take it for granted. However, what would Mass be like without it? That is what we are experiencing this weekend.

The AV Ministry has become such a vital part of our liturgies at St. Isidore, yet we are down to less than 10 AVengers in this ministry and need some help.

Anyone can do this ministry, regardless of your age (high school and up) or experience with computers. There is also flexibility built into this ministry in both scheduling and operation. You can serve at whichever Masses work best for you and can run slides from either the computer in the booth or from an iPad in the pews so you can sit with family.



But what about cameras and baptisms? When there are baptisms, AVengers are responsible for operating and projecting the cameras so everyone can share in this beautiful sacrament at Mass. Though this requires some extra steps and training, camera operation is much simpler than it might seem.

If you are willing to help us out in this ministry, we can set up one-on-one training and shadowing until you are comfortable. To sign up and serve as an AVenger today, go to our web site at stisidore.church/avengers or sign up in the office.

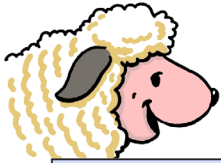
