

FR. RON'S RAMBLINGS

Today's Solemnity of the Epiphany is, liturgically, the brightest feast of the entire Christmas Season. Today we rejoice in our belief that Jesus is revealed as the Light for all people! The Magi are Gentiles; through following the star, they come to worship Jesus as the Lord. In the words of our solemn blessing for Epiphany, "The wise men followed the star, and found Christ, who is Light from Light. May (we) too find the Lord when our pilgrimage is ended!" Today is a celebration of Light, and of those who seek the Light.

January 6th is the Twelfth Day of Christmas, the day on which we celebrate the fullness of the Christmas mystery. In many Christian nations today is a legal holiday. In warmer climates Christians gather on beaches around large bonfires to celebrate the Light. It is also the day on which gifts are exchanged. This is in keeping with the gifts the Magi made to the infant. The exchange of gifts reflects our gratitude to God for the giving of God's self completely to us in the Incarnation. The gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh symbolize the total giving

CONNECTING POINT

How do I welcome the stranger and reverence their wisdom?

Epiphany is a good chance to reflect on the story of the Wise Men, three wealthy foreign "kings" who traveled a long way to seek Christ and offer him their gifts. There is a lot of mystery surrounding who they actually were (astrologers? magi? kings? wise men?), but regardless of their identity, nobody invited them to the party. These three foreigners traveled a long way to offer their gifts and reverence to Christ and were greeted with love.

Now imagine strangers coming into your home; you don't know if they are wealthy world leaders or migrant factory workers. Regardless, you don't recognize them, but they are clearly not from our country. What would your reaction be? Would you welcome them or kick them out?

What about church? In the weeks leading up to Christmas, we have been promoting "radical hospitality". This means going beyond just welcoming strangers, but helping them to feel included and part of our community. That's a tall task; I think that we all want our community to grow and for guests to feel included but often expect others to be the one to act on that.

One very important way that you can help strangers feel welcomed is through our First Impressions Team (FIT) ministry: the front line of welcoming at St. Isidore. Please consider being a part of this.

So what about the second part of the Connecting Point: what does "...reverence their wisdom" mean? Have you ever engaged in a conversation with someone who started sharing their opinion on a topic that opposed yours (e.g. sports, religion, politics)? It is very difficult to resist the urge to dismiss whatever they are about to say because you just don't want to hear it.

However, rather than dismissing whatever they are about to say, try giving them a chance to share their thoughts and just listen. You don't have to respond and defend an opposing viewpoint (as hard as it may be).

These are two great challenges for us in modern times, and very important ones if we are to be like Christ. Next time someone sits in "your" pew, or you bump into someone at St. Isidore (or anywhere for that matter), try reaching out and inviting them into a conversation. Maybe you both can learn something.



IRA ROLLOVER

Over 70-and-a half? What you need to know about the IRA charitable gift rollover.

Congress has extended and the president has signed the favorable IRA charitable rollover tax provisions for 2015, and made them permanent for future years.

What should a donor over age 70½ do in order to get the benefit that IRA distributions will not be included in taxable income? Donors should follow the same general procedures for IRA charitable distributions as in the past:

- Only direct distributions to charity up to \$100,000 qualify as tax-free.
 Distributions in exchange for a charitable gift annuity or to a charitable remainder trust do not qualify.
- It is especially important that the IRA distribution be made payable to the charity, not to you as the IRA owner and beneficiary. Otherwise, the distribution would not qualify for the favorable tax treatment. Advise your IRA administrator to make the distribution check payable to the Church or other charity, not to you.
- Only distributions from traditional or certain Roth IRAs are tax-free; the law does not apply to other qualified retirement plans, such as 401(k) plans. However, you should consider consulting with your financial or tax advisor about the possibility of transferring funds from one of these other qualified plans to establish an IRA, with the distribution to charity com-ing from the newly established IRA.
- Consult with your IRA administrator and tax advisor on the proper procedures for making a direct distribution to your parish, the Archdiocese of Detroit Endowment Foundation, the Catholic Services Appeal, Sacred Heart Major Seminary, Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan, or another archdiocesan institution or qualified charity.


