Lent begins this Wednesday! It is a time for us to go ever deeper into our spiritual life and experience spiritual renewal as we prepare to renew our Baptismal promises on Easter Sunday.

Lent began as a season of proximate preparation for those who were to be baptized at the Easter Vigil and was a time of special prayer, fasting, and penitence as they readied themselves for the new birth of Christian Baptism. Lent eventually became a time for the entire community to pray and fast for those to be baptized, and to purify itself to receive new members. It then became a season to pray and fast also for members of the community to pray for themselves as they approached the celebration of new life at Easter.

As a community, our focus during Lent is on those who will be entering our community at the Easter Vigil through the celebration of the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Eucharist. As individuals, Lent is a season to prepare ourselves for the renewal of our Baptismal promises on Easter.

CONNECTING POINT

When has my focus on the shortcomings of others blinded me to my own?

This is a difficult question to answer. If we are truly blind to our own shortcomings, how can we even answer it? Unfortunately, our realization of such times when we are blind is mostly in hindsight. Any time we focus on someone else's shortcomings, we are judging them as being flawed. We are placing ourselves in a superior place by comparison.

The Bible includes many reminders for us when we find ourselves in these dark places of judgment:

- Don't judge anyone by your human limitations. Only God's judgments are flawless. (JOHN 8:15-16)
- Don't be quick to condemn someone else's actions. God is patient, but He doesn't overlook anyone's disobedience, especially yours. (ROMANS 2:1-5)
- Don't attack each other. Try to be a good example so others won't copy your bad behavior. (ROMANS 14:13)
- Don't speak destructive things about others. Are you qualified to perfectly judge someone else? (JAMES 4:11-12)

When you find yourself in a place where you are about to judge someone, instead consider this prayer:

Dear Lord,
Instead of focusing on the shortcomings of others, help me seek your grace and a greater sensitivity to others. Allow my interior life of prayer to define me and shape the true essence of my character as you would have me.

Lenten Giving Tree

This year Ash Wednesday is March 6th, which also begins another St. Isidore Lenten Giving Tree Program. During Lent we spread God's Word through our good works around the world. As in past years, the St. Isidore parish family is sponsoring several charities and supporting God's people from around the world who are in desperate need. In future articles the Lenten Giving Tree committee will introduce you to the organizations and the charities for 2019.

Two of the three Lenten Giving Trees will be set up in the large gathering space with envelopes hanging from their branches, and the third tree will be set up by the Romeo Plank handicap accessible entrance. The envelopes will have instructions for you to choose the charity that you would like your donation to help. There is an informational flyer placed in each envelope for easy reference to each charity. The trees will be set up from March 6th, Ash Wednesday, through Sunday, April 7th. Envelopes will be collected through Palm Sunday, April 14th. Volunteers will be stationed at all three church entrances to collect your donations. If you are donating by check, please make the check payable to St. Isidore and on the memo line indicate which charity you would like to sponsor. Donations are tax-deductible and 100% of the contribution goes for services directly involving God's people we are sponsoring.
