As I depart St. Isidore, my hope is that my Jesuit superiors will now allow me the time (and money) to pursue my own artwork. This is the direction in which the Holy Spirit seems to be pulling me at this time, and it is where I find the greatest consolation. You can see a few of my artworks in the Gathering Area right now.

The oil paintings I did quite a number of years ago are very Christocentric-Last Supper, Passion of Christ, etc. Two of the most powerful themes of Christian art, especially in the western world, are the Madonna \& Child, and the Pieta. (The terms "Madonna" and "Pieta" are Italian because of the great Renaissance artists who popularized these motifs.) It fascinates me that in both of these images, the Blessed Mother is holding the naked and helpless body of her son; first as an infant, then after he has been taken down from the cross. This, of course, is the beginning and end of Jesus' life; theologically, it is the Incarnation and the Redemption.

Now, almost 20 years after I did this painting, I am working in a radically different vein. My work now is primarily three dimensional and quite abstract; almost none

of this current work is explicitly religious. In these works, I am combining two passions of mine; art and geometry. (I used to teach both subjects in high schools.) Geometric concepts include perfect solids, spirals, Mobius strips, and Hamiltonian circuits-whatever those are! Motifs include snowflakes and sunbursts, rainbows, stars and stripes, calligraphy, playing cards suits, even octopi! Many of these works will be soccer ball designs, ornaments, or hangings. These colorful shapes and patterns are expressions of joy, in contrast to the somber mood of many of my earlier paintings.

Unfortunately, very few of my current designs are finished products, and because this sort of work is very new to me, I do not even know yet how to make the finished products. But I am very excited about this new adventure. One of the pieces that I intend to do is a giant Christmas ornament to hang in our Gathering Area on the opposite side from where the Christmas tree is placed. I did the preliminary sketches and we bought the materials for this piece last December, but I did not have time to even begin the work. I hope to begin work on this soon as a Christmas present for you at the end of this year!
P.S: Here's a trivia question that I would be shocked if you can answer. The first bulletin article I wrote that appeared in the Harvest News, as it was called then, was written long before I even knew St. Isidore Church existed. When was this, and what was it about? To find the answer, look at the display of my artwork and other personal memorabilia in the Gathering Space.

What relationship in my life do I need to unconditionally reconcile?

This weekend we find ourselves halfway through the Season of Lent. We began the Season on Ash Wednesday by being marked with ashes. The ashes are, in part, a reminder of our mortality: we are dust, and unto dust we shall return. They bring us face to face with our death. During this season we reflect on whether we are living the kind of life we want to live, and whether we are ready to pass from this life. We then take the necessary steps to make whatever changes are needed. Perhaps for many of us, a major need is to restore a broken relationship.

Today's Gospel is often referred to as the "Parable of the Prodigal Son." Many claim that it should be known as the "Parable of the Prodigal Father," given the lavish way the father forgives his son, unconditionally with absolutely no strings attached. He wants nothing in return from his son, not even gratitude or the acknowledgment of his wrongdoing. In spite of the horrible way in which the son treated him, the father does not want to die alienated from someone he truly loved.

This leads me to ask myself: Who is the one person in my life I need to forgive unconditionally, no matter how badly they have treated me? During this Season of Lent, I humbly acknowledge my human frailty and the certainty of leaving loved ones behind at the time of my death. For my own peace of mind and ultimate happiness, and for their sake, who is the one person more than any other I need to forgive unconditionally this Lent, before it may be too late?

## LENTEN GIVING TREE

## This week's article is focusing on DB Peru Medication Hut Project as written by Peg Meyer, DB Peru representative.

One of the biggest, ongoing problems we encounter in the lower Napo River villages is the lack of simple medications available in the communities. There are no pharmacies or little stores for people to have access to basic medicines. When children have fevers or people have injuries, headaches, nausea or even simple aches and pains, there simply is no medicine available for relief. This is more than inconvenience; with no antibiotics, a child's bronchitis can turn to pneumonia. Physical labor is a regular part of everyday life here. Any impairment that interferes with their hunting, fishing, cooking, or building huts or canoes means a concern for livelihood.

In the last year, representatives from a company called Altro in London approached us about piloting a program to use their cladding product to test in the jungle environment. This product covers wood to keep humidity, dirt and insects from penetrating. They are willing to pay to have small medicine huts built in five communities, with a large inventory and storage hut built on our property in San Pedro. With these huts stationed along the river and backwaters of the region, 10 villages will have access, with the hut in San Pedro serving 8 more communities, serving a total of approximately 3,800 people. An architect from Lima has drawn up the plans for the huts which have been approved by the villages, by Altro, and by DB Peru.

DB Peru would like to collaborate as a partner on this important project. Our role would be to offer intense, compressive training for the involved health workers as well as to cover the start-up cost for the supply of medications. Health workers would manage the medication inventory, distribution and security with oversight by DB Peru. The medicine will be sold at an affordable government wholesale cost to the people, which will enable the health worker to purchase more medicines when depleted. This would create a sustainable supply of medicines for all the villages served, alleviate unnecessary suffering due to lack of basic medications, prevent routine illnesses from developing into deadly ones, and greatly improve overall quality of life in the region.
