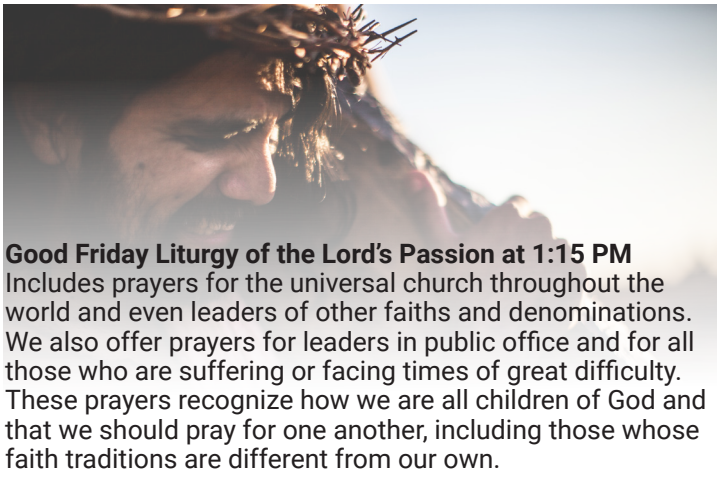

Good Friday Liturgy of the Lord's Passion at 1:15 PM
Includes prayers for the universal church throughout the world and even leaders of other faiths and denominations. We also offer prayers for leaders in public office and for all those who are suffering or facing times of great difficulty. These prayers recognize how we are all children of God and that we should pray for one another, including those whose faith traditions are different from our own.

If you can't make it to Good Friday Living Stations or Liturgy, take a few moments to reflect on the Passion of our Lord Jesus and consider the following:

- *What does the death of Jesus mean to me?*
- *How do I show respect for people of other faith traditions?*

Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday at 8:30 PM
Sometimes known as the "Granddaddy of all Catholic Liturgies," we celebrate our story from Creation through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus and how God is ever present and still working in our lives today. We also welcome new members into the church in the Sacraments of Initiation including Baptism, First Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. It's the biggest Catholic Liturgical Celebration of the Year! If you are unable to attend, take time to reflect on:

Miracles in Action - Guatemala

Magical Classroom

Magical classroom is a program that trains and equips young adults to teach children ages 4 - 6 in remote areas of Guatemala. It prepares previously disadvantaged rural children to be successful in the first grade and beyond. Currently operational in 22 rural communities, plans are underway to expand Magical Classroom to 50 within two years.

DB Peru - Peruvian Amazon

Palliative Care Project

Hospice Care for a person whose health is not expected to improve. Relieve suffering and provide dignity in a natural death. Reduce family stress and create space for a peaceful passing.

DB Peru - Lower Napo River

Medication Hut Project

One of the biggest, ongoing problems that DB Peru encounters in the Lower Napo River villages is the lack of simple medications available in the communities. When children have fevers or people have injuries, there is simply no medication available for relief. With no antibiotics, bronchitis can turn to pneumonia. Physical labor is a regular part of everyday life. Any impairment that interferes with hunting, fishing, cooking or building huts could mean a concern for livelihood

DP Peru - Lima, Peru

Santa Martha Foundation - Casa Hogar Villa, Pachacamac
Casa Hogar Villa Martha is a special place. It is a refuge for physically and emotionally abandoned children who live in this poor region just outside of Lima, Peru. The children receive consistent, loving care in a safe environment. They also receive a strong moral and spiritual foundation that teaches them value in the eyes of GOD.

At the Easter Vigil Mass, our Archdiocese will welcome 774 new members into full communion in the Catholic Church after a year of preparation through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

These 346 catechumens (those seeking entry into the Church through baptism) and 428 candidates (baptized Christians who wish to be members of the Catholic Church) were formally presented to Archbishop Allen Vigneron last month at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament. They affirmed their intentions to our Chief Shepherd and enrolled their names in the ceremonial Book of Life.

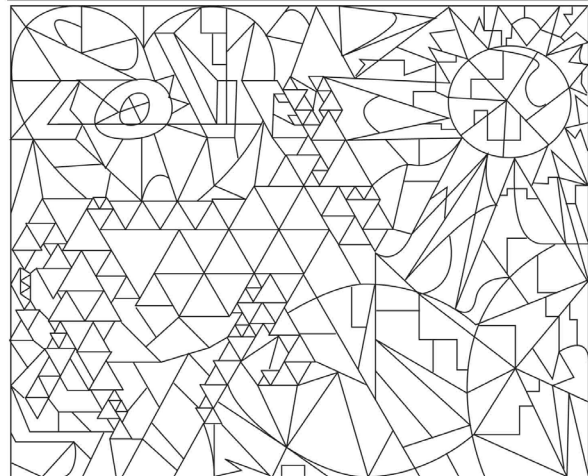
