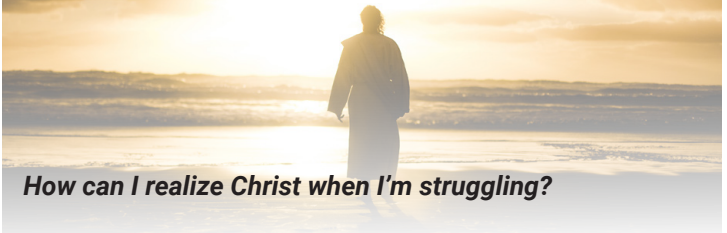

CONNECTING POINT



How can I realize Christ when I'm struggling?

Jesus is on the shore off in the distance while the disciples were on the boat fishing all night. They did not recognize Jesus when he appeared to them after their long night of not catching any fish.

The Gospel focuses on how we can get so bogged down by the busyness of our lives that we miss seeing the Lord standing on the shore calling to us.

We live in a fast-paced world of information and distraction. It seems that sometimes we are on a never-ending merry-go-round. It is during these times, that distract us from hearing Jesus calling out to us. We often do not notice his presence in the circumstances and events of our lives.

During my years of spending time with family, working, studying at the seminary, and diaconate formation, I found it a great challenge to slow down and find time to spend with Jesus. At times, I was so focused on my work and studies I failed to notice him. When I took time to pray, meditate in front of the blessed sacrament, or read scripture I reconnected with Jesus. I realized Christ was present in the patients I assisted with their insurance needs, he was present in my family members during times of joy and pain, he was present in my achievements and failures, he was present in illness and the loss of loved ones. He was always there celebrating my joys and comforting me in times of pain.

So, when you feel overwhelmed or pushed by the flood of life, take some time to get out of your boat! Go meet Jesus at the shore through prayer, meditation, before the blessed sacrament, through the rosary, or sacred scripture. Move your focus off the "catch of fish in your net" and let go to spend some time with the risen Lord.

I grew up in Clawson, MI where our family were members at Guardian Angels Parish and where myself and two brothers attended grade school followed by Clawson High School.

I have two daughters who also attended Guardian Angels (GA) School, and a nine-year old grandson. While at GA I conducted baptismal training classes, was a Eucharistic Minister, a member of the

Worship Commission and GAP (Guardian Angels Parents).

I began working at Michigan Bell Telephone in 1978 while also attending evening courses at Oakland Community College where I earned an Associates Degree. The last 30 years of my career were spent in IT with the final 20 focusing on databases / data warehouses, sales results reporting, web development and compensation. I remained with the Bell System / AT&T through divestiture, multiple mergers and acquisitions until my job ended in January, 2018.

After moving to Macomb Township in 2001, I thought I would take turns attending the multiple Catholic churches in the area to see which one 'fit.' I attended St. Isidore first and immediately felt at home never attending any of the other churches. Since then I have become involved in different ministries at St. Isidore including: Eighth Grade Catechist (since 2004), Strawberry Festival Committee (since 2012), Run the Plank Committee (since 2012), Eucharistic Minister (in parish and homebound since 2004), Evangelization Committee (since

2017) and RCIA Team Member (since 2018). I also support Camp Sancta Maria in Gaylord and am a volunteer of the CYO Adult Committee for the teen Rainbow Conference held in January (since 2015).

While my career was an amazing one, the last few years I began to feel God had other plans for me. I began to sense the gentle pull of the Holy Spirit preparing me for the closing of that chapter and a new and more amazing one that awaited. I began taking classes at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Fall, 2017 working toward a Lay Ecclesial Minister Certificate with an emphasis in RCIA. But it turns out, that was just the beginning. As of May 1, 2019, I have accepted the position of Youth Minister here at St. Isidore. To be able to not only take learning my faith to a whole new level but now also being able to share it with the teens of St. Isidore is an exciting and immense blessing while at the same time very humbling. I look forward to this next chapter with eagerness and enthusiasm and already know working with the SITE teens is going to be incredible.

Greetings, I'm (Fr.) Matthew Ellis, and I've been your neighbor at St. Therese in Shelby Twp. (2010-2016), and at St. Lawrence in Utica (2016-2019). How blessed I am to join everyone at St. Isidore! I was born in Detroit and grew up in Livonia, making me almost an immigrant, a "west-sider." Having now lived 24 years in total on the "east-side", I've become a "double-sider."

I was schooled in our Catholic School system since 1st grade. I graduated from Detroit Catholic Central in 1978, went to the University of Detroit for college and then the seminary and was ordained a priest in 1988. I've had numerous parish assignments here in the Archdiocese of Detroit since 1988. Before the ministry of the priesthood I had several work experiences as a 'yout,' oops, I mean 'youth.' At 13-years-old I was a private golf club summer caddy for three seasons. I've worked as an electrician's assistant and as an all-around helper at a nursing home for two full summers. In college, I

worked at a movie theater both full-time and part-time. As an adult, I took some time and became a pro truck driver at car-hauling using the big 75-foot tractor-trailers, loading, driving, and unloading.

Through my family's active involvement in our parish and other Catholic institutions, I came to know numerous priests, which was enriching and influential in finding the priesthood a viable life option and vocational calling for me. God and the many helpful people that were my sharers of life, aided my finding (warning: this may sound like Yogi Berra) 'the best way for me to be the me God made me to be.'

I happily anticipate meeting you and joining in the ministry with Fr. Ron and so many of you.

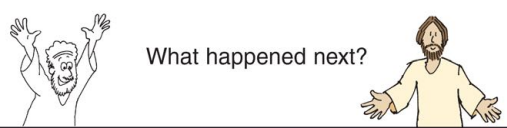
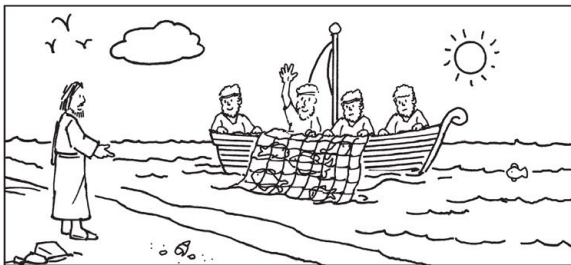
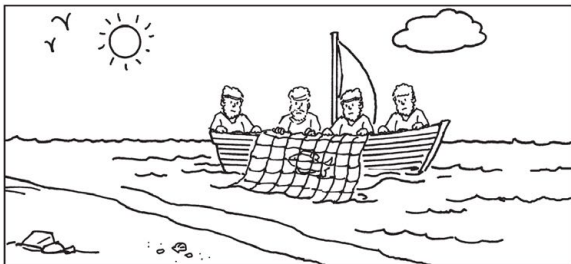
