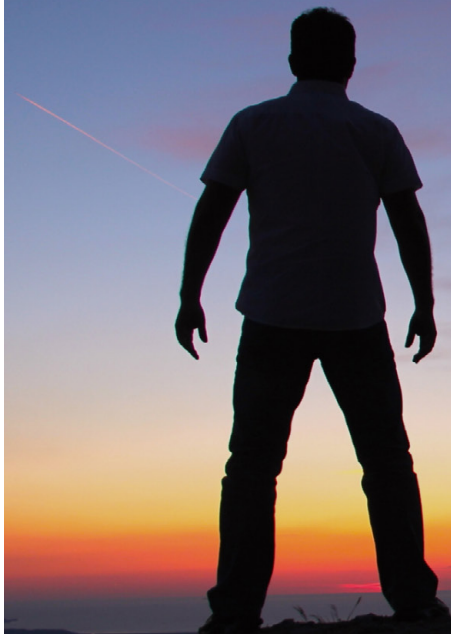

FR. RON'S REFLECTION

Today's Feast of Pentecost brings the Easter Season to a close. The high points of our Easter celebration were the Baptism, Confirmation, and First Eucharist of our four neophytes and four candidates for Full Communion with the Church at the Easter Vigil. Equally included were the celebrations of First Eucharist with our Second Graders on April 28 and May 5, as well as the many infant baptisms we celebrated throughout the season. We are reminded that we are an initiating community, always, through the work of the Holy Spirit, giving birth to new members.

Our "neophytes" ("newly baptized" members), Remi, Ermalinda, Solange, and Joe, have been wearing their white baptismal garments to Mass throughout the season. At 9:30 Mass today we celebrated a special ritual during which they removed that garment as a sign that the final phase of the RCIA process, known as mystagogia, has come to an end. We thank RCIA Coordinator John Kovacik, and our RCIA team of Beth Beebe, Ann DeRey, Bernadette Kovacik, Tim Palmer, and Bill Hicks for their outstanding ministry.

A belated "congratulations" to the twenty-seven high school and college graduates who joined us for our annual Graduation Mass last Sunday, June 2. We are blessed with an outstanding group of young people who are providing us great leadership through their Spirit-filled faith and passion for lives of service. We thank them for sharing this important moment in their life with their faith community.

The end of the Easter Season is an appropriate time to acknowledge and thank those of our parish community who serve our parishioners at the funeral celebration, or Mass of the Resurrection, upon the death of a loved one. CONNECTING POINT

How has the Holy Spirit helped me grow and mature?

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."

JOHN 14: 25, 26

Today (June 9), we celebrate Pentecost, also known as the birthday of the Church. As the Scripture from the Gospel of John outlines, Christ was with his Disciples and told them that the Holy Spirit would now be with each of them. Close your eyes and try to place yourself in that Upper Room as Christ delivered those powerful words. The Holy Spirit, the one who had spoken through the prophets, was being sent by the Father to guide us to hear the Word.

As we pray and participate in our various ministries and our daily lives, think about how often the Holy Spirit inspires us or intercedes for us. PENTECOST PROCESSION AND THE BIRTHDAY OF THE CHURCH

This Pentecost weekend we commemorate the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Jesus after his Ascension and so we celebrate the birthday of the Church.

The Latin name for Church (ecclesia) is actually a transliteration of a Greek word meaning "those duly summoned for an assembly, a public convocation." All who assemble form the Church.

We assemble from all cultures, backgrounds, ages and walks of life into one family that is The Body of Christ. Our entrance procession represents this gathering as all of us "pilgrims" enter from whatever parts of life we come with whatever "baggage" we carry. "So this is the entrance procession, coming from all directions, made up of all ages, a variety of races, economic circumstances and political outlooks."¹ But all are in a great procession, assembling in the house of the Church.

This Pentecost weekend, our entrance procession begins in the Holy Spirit wing, signifying that first anointing of the Holy Spirit and moves through the various aisles of our worship space, signifying our unity in Christ and in the celebration of our liturgy together.

We are all disciples, anointed and gifted in the Holy Spirit to do the work of our Savior Lord, Jesus Christ.

What is the Green Team?

In the Fall of 2018, the idea of a Green Team surfaced in a Leadership Team discussion. Shortly after the discussion occurred, Tony Kendzierski, St. Isidore's Christian Service Coordinator, began building a team of people to tackle this initiative. The Green Team typically meets one Wednesday a month at 10 AM.

What is the purpose of the Green Team?

The Green Team was created to assist the parish in moving toward green initiatives such as recycling, reusing, and reducing. Additionally, we plan to serve as an education team on items that concern the proper stewardship of the earth. The primary focus is looking for cost-effective measures to reduce, reuse, and recycle.

St. Isidore Green Initiatives that have occurred over the last 12 months:

- Installed new LED lighting throughout the exterior of the facility. (Reduced power consumption)
- Installed low flow faucet aerators and pre-rinse sprayers. (Reduced water/gas consumption)
- Installed LED bulbs in the social hall and the gathering space; the bulbs were supplied for free by DTE. (Reduced power consumption)
- Secured a cardboard recycling container with a bi-weekly pick-up. (Recycle)
- Began the migration process of moving away from Styrofoam and toward more earth-friendly options such as paper. (Recycle)
- Reached an agreement to replace the majority of the light troffers with new LED lighting. (Reduced power consumption)
- Proactively program the lighting system to minimize unneeded lighting of the facility. (Reduced power consumption)
- Secured a local vendor for the recycling of batteries. (Recycle)

Future opportunities:

- Recruit a team to help enact green initiatives at events. The current event coordinators (Fish Fry, Strawberry Festival, etc.) already have a huge responsibility, so if we want to see the change we have to physically provide the alternative so that we reduce the amount of work of the event coordinators, not create work for them.
- Price out eco-friendlier packaging to see if this is an option as we move forward. (Recycle)
- Schedule an annual e-waste recycling event for the parish. (Recycle)
- Secure permanent recycling options for plastic and metal. (Recycle)
