Like Moses in the first reading from this weekend, sometimes we need help when we become weary. I am thankful for the support and love of my wife who strengthens me when I feel worn down. 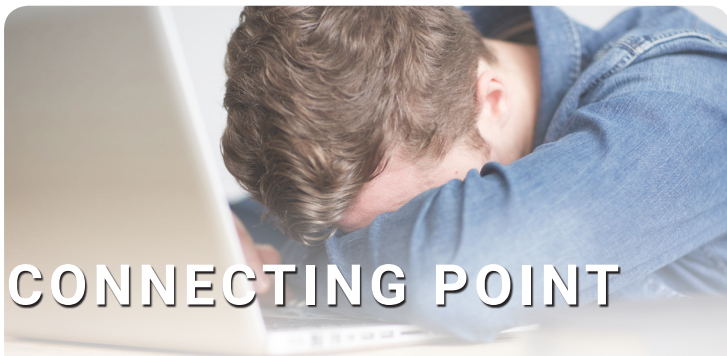

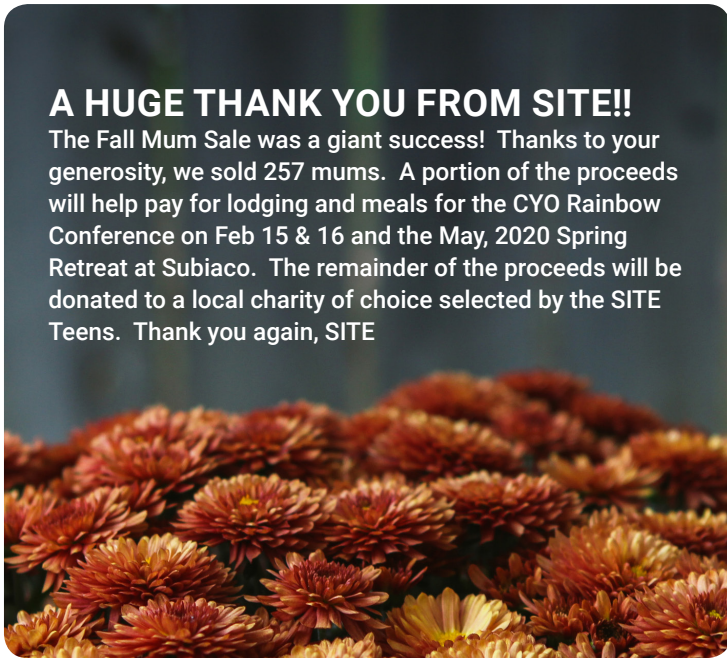

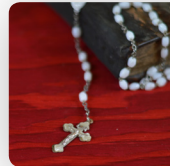

The Holy Spirit, through the assistance of the Worship Commission and the Parish Leadership Team, would like to invite you to join the Adoration Team and commit one hour of private prayer before the most Holy Eucharist.

The exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is available every Tuesday immediately following morning Mass and concludes with Benediction at 6:00 pm. The Chapel is located in the Resource Center which is the first door on the right after entering through the Rosary Garden entrance.

There is no formal format to private Eucharistic Adoration. Say the Rosary or

your favorite prayers, read scripture, talk to the Lord and share your burdens, or just sit in His presence and let Him speak to you.

There are several people who have committed to certain hours and there are over 40 people who stop in each week and take the time to sign in to the log book. With the upcoming winter months, additional commitments to a specific hour are needed to cover absences and "Snow Bird" vacancies.

Feel free to stop in anytime; spend a few minutes or an hour. 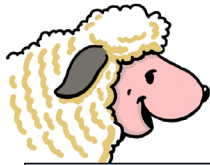

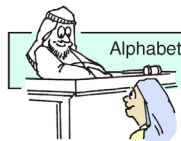
