November has been designated by the Church as a month to pray in a particular way for the Faithful Departed. Throughout the month there will be a Book of Life near the baptismal pool for parishioners to inscribe the names of departed loved ones you would like us to remember in our Masses and prayers throughout the month.

This Monday evening at 7:00 we will be celebrating our annual Service of Remembrance for the one hundred and ten people buried from St. Isidore over the past year. We have invited their families to join us. During the service, a candle will be lit for each deceased loved one as they are prayed for and honored by name. Those candles, in turn, will be burning in the sanctuary at weekend Masses throughout the month,

The cross, in honor of their loved one which has been placed on our memorial board in the back of the worship space will be returned to the family as part of the service. CONNECTING POINT

Who around me is in need today?

"Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." LK 19:9-10

Have you ever felt like you needed to be rescued? Or do you know a family member or friend that may be in need. When I was younger, I really enjoyed search and rescue movies. Whether it be a huge blockbuster like *Saving Private Ryan* or a smaller movie like *Willow*, I always enjoyed the idea of a hero/heroine rescuing someone. Although those movies were for Hollywood, there was still a message of hope and a lesson about people reaching out to help someone in need.

In Today's Gospel, Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector, is in need of rescue and is looking to Christ for help. Even when an obstacle like height slows him down, Zacchaeus is determined to witness the Lord. Jesus sees Zacchaeus, like he sees all of us, and calls him by name. I think we forget sometimes that the Lord is always calling us by name to be with him. Jesus invites Zacchaeus to be close with him and have fellowship with him.

So is there someone in your life that is in need? Is there someone you can turn to, say their name and ask them if they need to talk? Sometimes that person is right in front of you. Do not let an opportunity pass to ask them how they are doing. In this secular, social-media-driven world, we as Christians have an obligation to take care of one another. Let's love one another and help each other to come down from our trees and embrace Jesus Christ, the greatest rescuer of all time.

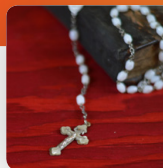

WHERE WILL THE TREES BE LOCATED?

There will be three trees located just inside the Romeo Plank and the 23 Mile entrances to the church.

DESCRIBE THE ORNAMENTS?

All you need to do is place your gifts inside this envelope and check off the families/agencies you wish to help, seal the envelope and return it to church.

WHAT DO WE GIVE?
