FR. RON'S REFLECTIONS

Celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation is an important part of our Advent preparation for the celebration of the Lord's Coming, both at the end of time and at Christmas. For several years we have joined with three other North Macomb Vicariate parishes: St Lawrence, St. Therese, and St. John Vianney, in celebrating Communal Penance Services during Advent and Lent. Communal Penance Services celebrate not only our conciliation with God, but with each other in the Christian community. We sin not only against God, but against each other. Celebrating God's mercy, and joining with others in praising the God of Mercy, is an act of communal worship. I strongly encourage you to participate in one of these communal penance services listed elsewhere in this bulletin. Our service here at St. Isidore is next Saturday, December 14, at 1:00 PM.

We also encourage you to join us tonight, December 8, at 7:30 PM for "A Festival of Lessons and Carols." This is a beautiful Scripture-based concert featuring outstanding

choirs and chorales. It too is an opportunity to enter more deeply into this beautiful Advent season of joyful anticipation.

I also recommend considering taking more time in Eucharistic adoration as a way of deepening your prayer life during this Advent Season. Eucharistic Exposition is in our Resource Center on Tuesdays following 8:30 Mass until benediction at 6:00 PM, and for one hour prior to our Friday morning Mass at 8:00.

We thank the Altar Society for sponsoring "Peppermint Christmas Hospitality" after all the Masses next weekend. Please plan on staying after Mass for a few minutes to "meet and greet" fellow parishioners, especially those new to our community.

Also, we thank the Knights of Columbus and Ushers Club for setting up our beautiful outside Manger Scene. Please join us following the 4:30 Mass next Saturday when the Knights will be lighting up the scene.

Next Sunday is the Third Sunday of Advent when we wear Rose vestments. Rose is the color of the sky just before dawn! We rejoice that our Savior is near. We encourage you to wear rose or pink clothing to Mass next week and to bring the "Baby Jesus" from your home manger scene to be blessed at Mass.

What obstacles are keeping me from being welcoming to all?

I don't think there is anyone who would say that they aren't welcoming. Whether talking about our church or our home, we'd all like to think that we are welcoming.

Welcoming means smiling at someone when they look at you. It means helping someone with directions when they ask. But welcoming also means giving up your seat when the church is full, it means giving a smile instead of a scowl when you hear a child around you crying.

Christmas is a time when many people come to church who may not attend every Sunday. Being welcoming by giving up your 'regular' seat or resisting the urge to glare at someone on their phone or those talking during the homily is a tough task. It might even be considered radical... but it is a part of being welcoming.

In this Sunday's gospel, John calls for radical change in the lives of his community. He asks the people to let go of their pasts by immersing themselves in the living waters in anticipation of the arrival of the Messiah. Next to this call of the Baptist, we hear the words of Saint Paul to the Romans, inviting us to come together in Christ, who welcomes us into his heart, both fulfilling the promises of the past and creating a new path into the future.

As we prepare for Christmas, what obstacles keep us from being welcoming to others and how can we avoid them? As Christmas draws closer and life gets a little crazier, our patience can grow thinner. Let's think radically and really up our game with how welcoming we can be.


