FR. RON'S REFLECTIONS

This weekend we welcome Fr. Adam MacDonald to St. Isidore, Fr. MacDonald is the Vocation Director with the Divine Word Missionaries. He is here to help us celebrate "Vocation Sunday." The Divine Word Missionaries played a large part in my discernment regarding my vocation. While in grade school I joined their Vocation Club. However, when it came time to enter a high school seminary back in 1965, I chose to enter our archdiocesan seminary, Sacred Heart Seminary High School.

I was in fifth grade when I began to seriously consider the priesthood. I am sometimes asked why I wanted to be a priest. First, my parents, Monica and Leonard, were practicing Catholics who truly lived their faith. They sent us to Catholic grade school, where I was much influenced by the religious women who taught there. I was also influenced by Fr. Ray Marshall, the pastor of St. Dorothy Parish in Warren, of which my family were founding members. I looked up to Fr. Marshall and saw him as a humble, holy, and happy man. I think my "call" came through my parents, my teachers at St. Rose and St. Clement Grade Schools, and Fr. Marshall. I saw the priesthood as a way to serve




BABY PANTRY
