FR. RON'S REFLECTIONS

We are now less than two weeks away from Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Lent is in many ways a forty-day long parish-wide retreat during which time we prepare to celebrate the Paschal Mystery at Easter and welcome new members into the community at the Easter Vigil. As a parish, our focus is on praying for and supporting the catechumens and candidates with whom we will be celebrating the Easter sacraments and purifying our faith community as we prepare to welcome new members. On a personal level, Lent is a time for penance and transformation as we prepare to renew our Baptismal Promises on Easter Sunday.

It is important to respect the communal aspect of Lent. Community prayer and action are central to our Lenten experience. For instance, the signing of our foreheads with ashes on Ash Wednesday is a communal experience, where we enter into the season as a penitential community. Our Mardi Gras celebration is communal preparation for Lent. We have many additional communal celebrations during Lent, such as weekly Stations of the Cross and Communal Penance Services. The Lenten Giving Tree is a way we

come together as a community to give alms. Friday abstinence is a communal act of penance. To eat meat on those days is not so much a sin against God as it is a sin against the community. We separate ourselves from our communal act of fasting. Even our Friday Fish Frys help us to come together as a community.

Our parish team is preparing a very creative experience to strengthen our communal Lenten celebration and to make this Lent a forty-day parish-wide retreat. This experience is modeled after Dynamic Catholic's "Best Lent Ever" program in which Matthew Kelly and his team provide daily reflections throughout the season. Many of us have subscribed to these reflections and found them to be inspirational and effective in enriching our Lenten experiences. Our team members will be offering our own reflections which will more directly address our community here in Macomb. This is a great way to connect with our parish team & community throughout the season, enhancing our communal Lenten experience. How can I seek God's wisdom in daily challenges?

Eucharistic Adoration Substitutes Needed

Perpetual Adoration extends its influence far beyond the individual adorers, touching their home and families and reaching out to the parish community and beyond. (Pope Paul VI)

We are looking for people who would be willing to sign up as potential substitutes to the regularly assigned adorers. Occasionally, we have someone who cannot cover their regular hour for a given week or two. It would be nice to have a list of potential substitutes that we could draw from to help fill these vacancies. If you are willing to be available as an occasional substitute please contact us using one of the options below.

Of course, we would also love to have more adorers sign up for any regular time slot to help fill our Adoration Chapel.

The exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is available every Tuesday immediately following morning Mass and concludes with Benediction at 6:00 pm. The Chapel is located in the Resource Center which is the first door on the right after entering through the Rosary Garden entrance.

There is no formal format to private Eucharistic Adoration. Say the Rosary or your favorite prayers, read scripture, talk to the Lord and share your burdens, or just sit in His presence and let Him speak to you.

If you cannot commit to being a substitute or a regular adorer please feel free to stop in anytime during the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesdays; spend a few minutes or an hour.

Teen's recent Pajama Project where multiple people during the weekend shared their stories of either personally being in Foster Care when they were younger or family members taking in children, sometimes eventually adopting. Thank you for sharing your beautifully moving stories and experiences. And thank you for your support of the collection. On Saturday, Feb 1st the S.I.T.E. Teens visited Friends of Foster Kids delivering:

70 Fleece Blankets, 253 Pajamas, & A check for \$2,340.30

When I originally spoke with Theresa at Friends of Foster Kids to schedule a drop off date for our Pajama Project collection (Jan 25 & 26) I shared parishioners had already dropped off 50 pairs of pj's before the event took place. I don't think any of us, including the S.I.T.E. Teens, could have imagined the final result. The generosity of the parishioners of St. Isidore along with the assistance of 8th graders earning their Christian Service Hours for Confirmation and the management of the S.I.T.E. Teens made this an overwhelmingly successful event.

Sometimes we don't get to know or see the lives we've touched. But isn't that how the Holy Spirit works? Behind the scenes, not taking credit, always moving and doing.


