FR. RON'S REFLECTIONS

We begin to count the forty days of Lent today, the First Sunday of Lent. We begin today because today is the first time the entire community has been able to gather together. Lent will come to an end at sunset on April 9th, when we begin celebrating the Easter Triduum.

In Sacred Scripture, periods of trial and testing are often associated with the number forty. For example, the Israelites spent forty years in the desert, Moses spent forty days and forty nights on Mt. Sinai to receive the Ten Commandments, it rained for forty days and nights to cause the flood at the time of Noah, and Jesus spent forty days and forty nights fasting in the desert before being tempted by Satan.

Lent is a time of trial and testing. As members of the baptized, we realize that we have not always lived up to our baptismal promises. Our actions and attitudes do not always reflect Gospel values. During Lent we spend forty days and nights listening more attentively to the word of God and spending more time in fervent prayer. We do this in order to reorient our lives to Christ as we prepare to renew our baptismal promises on

Easter Sunday. I encourage you to enter fully into this season.

I am very excited about our parish Lenten Video Project which was introduced at Masses last weekend and on Ash Wednesday. This is truly an "outside the box" project for an individual parish. Lent is also a time for the entire parish to accompany our Catechumens and Candidates for Full Communion with the Catholic Church as they prepare for the Easter Sacraments on Holy Saturday. More on that next week!

How will I resist even the smallest temptations this Lent?

In the Gospel today, Jesus is alone in the desert and shows complete obedience to his Father's will. Jesus tells the devil "You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." Remember, Jesus had been fasting and even still did not flinch at the devil's temptation. Jesus gave us the perfect example of obedience. So how do we live out this example during this Lenten season? How do we resist temptation?

First, it's important to experience our own fast during Lent. A lot of us think that means giving up something or not eating meat on Fridays. Both of those things are important; it is important to sacrifice over Lent. In our sacrifice, we show our gratitude to the Lord and we reflect on our faith. Yet, giving up something is not all that Lent is about. Lent is also about doing something extra. One of my favorite Lenten "fast" stories came from a friend. A few years ago she realized that the nursing home that her grandmother was in had minimal entertainment. She had a gift for music so she decided that during Lent she would go once a week and sing for her grandmother and the other residents. She would tell me that her decision to do something "extra" made it her best Lent ever.

Second, we resist temptation through prayer. There are all different types of prayer that can help us strengthen our relationship with the Lord. We can use meditative prayer to put ourselves in the presence of Christ. We can also pray the rosary and ask our Holy Mother to intercede for us. Another way is to practice Lectio Divina prayer to dive deeper into Scripture. Whatever type of prayer each of us chooses, we are spending time with the Lord and his love can help us overcome anything.

This Lenten season take time to "fast" and take time everyday to pray. These two things alone will help resist even the smallest of temptations.


Come Encounter Christ In a Unique Way

The Resounding Worship Project continues to progress in a positive fashion. In mid-February we replaced the sanctuary lights with new LED spot lights. The new lights run on less energy saving the church thousands of dollars, provide greater flexibility with the Mass setting, are brighter (something Fr. Ron has wanted for a long time), and are virtually maintenance free. We used funds raised through our Changing Lives Together initiative to fund this portion of the project.

For the time being, we are going to delay the replacement of the house lighting until a later date. Our plan, for now, is to test out a series of bulbs that match the original lighting schematic. If successful, we believe this is a cost effective approach to delay the replacement of the current house lighting system. The replacement lights have been ordered, and we hope to have them installed prior to our Easter celebrations.

The next area of focus will be our video capabilities in church. Please check the website for further updates and timeline.

This week I would like to introduce the three charities the 2020 Lenten Giving Tree committee has chosen to help. Our charities have been switched up this year to freshen it up. We will be sponsoring: water.org and Cross Catholic Outreach and their charities.

Water.org was founded in 2009 by Matt Damon and Gary White. Water.org is a global, nonprofit organization working to bring water and sanitation to the world, making it safe, accessible and cost effective. They help people gain access to safe water and sanitation through affordable financing such as small loans. They give their everything every day to empower people in need with this life changing resource - giving women hope, children health and families a bright future.

Water.org - Cambodia

Approximately 3 million people out of the total population in Cambodia lack access to safe water, and 6.5 million lack access to improved sanitation. With approximately 77 percent of Cambodians living in rural areas, poor access to safe water and sanitation disproportionately affects its rural communities.

Water.org - Tanzania

Only 57 percent of Tanzania's population of 57 million have access to an improved source of safe water, and only 30 percent of Tanzania's population has access to improved sanitation. Under these circumstances people, particularly women and girls, spend a significant amount of time traveling some distance to collect water.

Cross Catholic Outreach

Santa Rosa Housing - Provide Safe Shelter for poor Families in the Diocese of Santa Rosa de Lima, Guatemala

Highlights:

- Many poor Guatemalan Families live in dilapidated shacks, cobbled together by mud, sticks and plastic.
- These homes leave families vulnerable to harsh weather, illness, poor hygiene, vermin infestation and break-ins.
- The People's Holy Mission offers Catholic spiritual formation, an important part of the Diocese of Santa Rosa de Lima's strategy for evangelization and long-term spiritual transformation, as well as property relief.
