FR. RON'S REFLECTIONS

The Season of Lent began in the Church as the time of proximate preparation of those who were to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. Adult Baptisms take place at the Easter Vigil because of our belief that in Baptism one actually dies with Christ (the three immersions under the water represent the three days Christ was in the tomb) and rises with him to new life. During Lent, our focus as a community is on those who are to enter the Church at the Easter Vigil. It is also a time for the parish community to purify itself as it prepares to receive new members.

Among the rites we celebrate with our catechumens during Lent are "scrutinies," which will be celebrated at the 9:30 Mass on each of the upcoming Sundays. The scrutinies are a time for the catechumens to examine their lives and ask God to remove from their lives anything which may keep them from fully living the Christian faith. We, as a community, will pray over them and call on the Holy Spirit to prepare them to live the Christian life. It is a very rigorous celebration and one which the individual catechumens spend much time preparing for in prayer.

How do I live out the holy life to which God is calling me?

"He saved us and called us to a holy life, not according to our works, but according to his own design."

2 TIMOTHY 1:9

The challenge from today's second reading of living a holy life sounds daunting. It is easy to dismiss this calling, as it is more plausible to believe that religious sisters, or priests such as Fr. Ron or Fr. Matt are meant to live holy lives, but not the rest of us. But the second reading from St. Paul to Timothy does not differentiate on who is called to live in this manner, because this call is universal, it is for all of us. The question isn't if we are called, but rather how we go about it.

Matthew Kelly, in his book *The Biggest Lie in The History of Christianity*, reinforces the fact we are called to live holy lives. He suggested focusing on creating holy moments throughout our days. His point is that if we are conscious of making at least one holy moment a day, we are on the path to living holy lives.

I think Lent is a great time to focus our lives. This is a great time to intentionally choose moments throughout the day that help us to be holy. Starting our day by going to Mass, or saying a prayer of Thanksgiving, allows us to focus the day on the Lord. Visiting someone who is lonely can create a holy moment. Making a meal for a loved one, whether it is packing a lunch or preparing dinner, is a selfless act, an act of holiness. Helping a neighbor to shovel their driveway creates a moment of mercy; indeed, another holy moment. Participating in a Bible study, or reading great spiritual books, can allow for holy moments. There are numerous ways to infuse these moments into our lives, we just need to be aware that we can be intentional about them, and over time, with great dedication, our lives can be filled with them. Once this is the case, we are living holy lives.

If you'd like to know more about creating holy moments, I would highly recommend reading, *The Biggest Lie in The History of Christianity*. If you don't have time to read the book, but you are ready and willing to commit your life to holiness, simply commit to one holy moment right now. Once you do, you are on your way to living a holy life.

This week's article will focus on water.org Cambodia.

Cambodia's Water and Sanitation Crisis

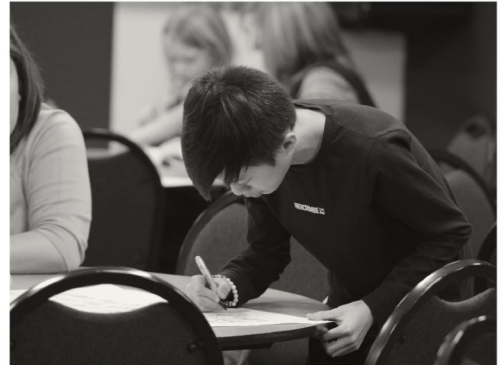
Approximately 3 million people out of the total population in Cambodia lack access to safe water, and 6.5 million lack access to improved sanitation. With approximately 77 percent of Cambodians living in rural areas, poor access to safe water and sanitation disproportionately affects its rural communities. Although Cambodia has one of the fastest growing economies in Asia, the GDP per capita still remains low compared to neighboring countries, and access to affordable financing for water and sanitation remains

a barrier for families in need to secure water connections and toilets for their homes. Cambodia is an ideal environment for our WaterCredit solution. A well-developed micro finance sector in a country with high water and sanitation needs represents an excellent platform for expanding access to affordable financing for water supply and sanitation improvements. Water.org laid the groundwork in Cambodia in 2014 and launched the first WaterCredit program in 2015.

Water.org is now working with 10 local micro finance institutions and meeting the demand of low-income families. Our partners started lending activities in the fall of 2016, after finalizing market research and

loan product development. The program had an ambitious goal of reaching more than 300,000 people in three years and we achieved that goal in less than two years. This demonstrates suitability of our WaterCredit solution in the Cambodian market as well as the strong commitment of our partner institutions. Water.org sees great potential to scale our impact in Cambodia by expanding WaterCredit as well as implementing other innovative interventions to reach even more people with access to safe water and sanitation.
